Chairman Banner called the meeting to order at 5:10 P.M. and directed the committee's attention to Mr. Hickey who requested a committee introduction of a bill regarding hiring of residents of Nevada for employment with the MX: BDR 53-1971*. The committee voted unanimously for introduction with Mrs. Cafferata voting against introduction for the reason that she objected to any new bills being introduced at this late date in the session.

AB-208: Removes denial of unemployment compensation for certain school employees under specified circumstances.

Mr. Thompson moved a DO PASS on AB-208; seconded by Mr. Jeffrey.

The committee discussed this bill at some length, going over the testimony from previous meetings of March 17 and March 31, 1981, and finally deciding to include an amendment drawn up by Larry Mc Cracken, Director, Employment Security Department, attached hereto as EXHIBIT A.

The original motion was withdrawn and Mr. Thompson moved a DO PASS AS AMENDED AB-208; seconded by Mr. Jeffrey and carried unanimously with all the committee members present. (9-0)

AB-629: Removes exemption contractors have on certain federal projects from statutory provision governing contractors.

Mr. Hickey informed the committee that AB-629 was drafted at the request of the Contractor's Board. A national representative of said board wishes to testify on this bill. Additionally, a constitutional problem has been raised by the Legislative Counsel Bureau and with that in mind Mr. Hickey asked the committee to hear this bill at a later date.

Mr. Banner scheduled the hearing for this and several other bills for Monday, May 18, 1981.

The committee unanimously voted to suspend the five day rule on hearing notices of the Labor and Management Committee.

There being no further business, Mr. Banner adjourned the meeting at 5:35 P.M.

The purpose of this memorandum is to provide you with two additional items of information on subject Bill:

First, staff in the Regional Office, U. S. Department of Labor - San Francisco, are conferring with their counterparts in the National Office to determine the seriousness of any conformity issue that may be raised with federal law if the Legislature approves AB 208 as presently drafted.

Secondly, after further conferring with USDOL Regional Office staff regarding possible alternatives you may want to consider, it is suggested that to accomplish approximately the same purpose, the following new language could be substituted for that found on page 1, lines 19 through 23, of the original draft:

"These benefits will become payable at any time the assurance of reemployment is shown not to be bona fide, provided the claimant has continued to file for benefits and to comply timely with all other requirements of the law."
