Chairman Price called the meeting to order at 1:45 p.m. and directed attention to SB 588.

SB 588: Increases additional fee for registration of motor vehicle which is accounted for in highway patrol special fund.

Mr. Pete Zadra, Department of Motor Vehicles Highway Patrol, said that this bill requests that the highway patrol special fee be increased from the present \$3.00 to \$4.00 in order to keep the highway patrol special fund solvent during fiscal year 1982-83. He noted that in the previous four fiscal years, an amount of \$693,000 was taken from the special fund account and moved to the highway patrol regular account to reduce the amount of appropriation from the highway fund. At the time that this was done, Mr. Zadra said that it was pointed out that the fund would go in the red if continued and will, in fact, in the 1982-83 fiscal year.

Mr. Zadra distributed to the committee a memorandum containing estimated funding and expenditure projections which is attached as EXHIBIT A pages 1 through 6.

When Mr. Mello asked if more patrolmen were to be hired, Mr. Zadra indicated that this was only to maintain the present level; that if this bill does not pass, they would lose about 25 troopers.

Mr. Mello moved DO PASS on <u>SB 588</u>, seconded by Mr. Glover and carried unanimously by the members present with Mrs. Westall, Mr. Polish and Mr. DuBois absent at the time of the vote.

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SB 643: Provides department of motor vehicles greater power to enforce certain statutes and regulations governing motor carriers.

Mr. Wink Richards, Chief of the Motor Carrier Division, said that two task force studies had been conducted, one for the Public Service Commission and one for the Governor's Task Force, and both recommended that the inspectors be transferred into the Motor Carrier Division. He indicated that the money committees have agreed to the transfer and SB 643 will give them the power to adopt and enforce the rules and regulations. Mr. Richards distributed to the committee a summary of the provisions of SB 643 which are attached as EXHIBIT B.

Mr. Daryl Capurro, Nevada Motor Transport Association, said that the money committees have already transferred the budgetary part and SB 643 will transfer the power. He indicated that his organization originally felt that it could dilute the effectiveness of these inspectors by moving them into the motor carrier enforcement personnel who are primarily revenue agents. However, he said, since these people have already been moved within the budget, SB 643 is necessary, and his organization would give "reluctant support."

Mr. Heber Hardy, Public Service Commission, said that this provision was a part of AB 58 as a recommendation of their study people, and they do support SB 643 because it will accomplish the same thing that was requested in AB 58.

Mr. Mello moved DO PASS on SB 643, seconded by Mr. Beyer and carried unanimously by members present with Mrs. Westall and Mr. Polish absent at the time of the vote.

Since there was no further business, Chairman Price adjourned the meeting at 2:00 p.m.

INCREASE IN HIGHWAY PATROL SPECIAL FEE - S.B. 588

The Department of Motor Vehicles with approval of the State Budget Director, proposed to increase the Highway Patrol Special Fee from \$3.00 to \$4.00. We submit the following comments and estimated funding and expenditure projections for your information.

The Department has researched previous executive budget recommendations, copies of which are attached, and determined that over a period of four previous fiscal years, FY 76, 77, 78, 79; an amount of \$693,146 dollars was transferred from the Highway Patrol Special Budget Account (4707) to the Highway Patrol Budget Account (4713) as partial support for the appropriated budget. Had these funds been carried forward in the Highway Patrol Special Budget Account each year, the fund would have been solvent for the 82/83 biennium.

The recommended budget for Highway Patrol Special (4707) currently being considered by the legislature reflects the Department's request to increase the present \$3.00 fee to \$4.00 effective July 1, 1981.

### Program Statement

The Nevada Highway Patrol Special Fund is supported as set forth in Nevada Revised Statutes 482,480. The authorized personnel total 70 patrolten. The goals and responsibilities are identical and supportive to those expressed in the regular Highway Patrol budget narrative.

#### Sub-Account Explanations

In-State Travel - The amount recommended will provide for per diem and travel for special inservice training sessions and routing in-state travel, including patrol and court appearances.

Of renting - Except those expenditure areas that can be directly related to patrolpen funded within this account, the amounts recommended in the operating categories represent 46.4% of the regular llighway Patrol operating category. That percentage is derived from the number of patrolpen in this account (70) as they relate to the total number of authorized, complasioned personnel (151) as specified in NRS 481.145.

Vehicle Operation - The amount recommended is based on actual amounts spent in 1975-76 plus moderate inflationary increases.

Clothing and Uniform Allowance - The amount recommended provides for moderate inflationary increases in commissioned personnel's uniform costs.

#### Equipment

Automobiles - The amount recommended provides for 20 replacement patrol cars in each fiscal year.

Other Equipment - The amount recommended provides for replacement of articles that are lost, stolen, or wornout.

Transfer to Highway Patrol - The amount recommended to be transferred. from the Highway larrol Special Account allows for administrative overhead costs and equipment purchases (except automobiles) used by the entire Patrol but generally charged to the appropriated account.

new dispatch consoles, radio scanners, emergency backup generator for Carson City, radar test equipment, dual trace oscilliscopes, and a telephone channel switch.

Communications Board Assessment - The amount recommended provides payment to the Communications Board for fifty-eight microwave channel ends utilized by the Highway Patrol.

Ilighway Patrol Vehicles - The amounts recommended provide for thirty replacement lighway Patrol vehicles and new vehicles for the Tactical Officers in fiscal year 1979-80. In fiscal year 1980-81, the recommendation provides for thirty replacement vehicles and an additional snow cat for use in getting to remote mountainlop communication sites with the required repair equipment.

General Fund SCOPE Assessment - The recommendation provides for the estimated amount required by user State agencies, not including lilghway Patrol, for their percentage use of the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department's SCOPE System (Criminal Justice Data Information System).

llichway Patrol SCOPE Assessment - The recommendation provides for the

estimated amount required by the Highway Patrol for its percentage use of the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department's SCOPE System.

Vehicle Replacement - Self-Insured - in fiscal year 1978-79, due to rising insurance costs, the Highway Patrol undertook a program of self-Insurance for Highway Patrol vehicles and dropped collision insurance being carried on the cars. It is recommended the program be continued.

Switcher Operation - The recommended amount provides for those anticipated costs of operating the high speed communication switcher (additional tapes, data processing costs, contract payments, line charges, etc.). This had previously been paid partly by the State and partly by users. It is recommended the General Fund pay all operating costs with each user paying for its share of the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department's SCOPE System (the data base for criminal justice activities).

# MOTOR CARRIER DIVISION

## SB 643

The consultant firm which evaluates the Public Service Commission and the Governor's Task Force both recommended that certain Public Service Commission Inspectors be transferred to the Department of Motor Vehicles. These recommendations were suggested because of the similarity in enforcement duties.

SB 643 provides the Department of Motor Vehicles with the duty to:

- 1. Enforce regulations adapted by the Public Service Commission.
- 2. Admit their that regularizes to enforce Department of Transportation and literature Commerce Commission as they exist.
- 3. Place unsafe commercial vehicles out of service when such vehicles are considered unsafe to continue upon the highway.

The bill enhances the recommendations for the Department of Motor Vehicles to absorb three Public Service Commission Inspectors, thereby combining enforcement duties relative to commercial carriers which operate through and within the state of Nevada.

These positions are approved in the Department of Motor Vehicles Budget.
