Chairman Bremner called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m.

AB 639: Makes appropriation to Nevada Racing Commission for support of Henderson track.

Mr. Duane Goble of the Racing Commission, stated that because of the decreased handle at Las Vegas Downs, the Commission is in need of an additional appropriation to finish this fiscal year.

Chairman Bremner asked how much the handle at Las Vegas Downs has decreased. Mr. Goble stated that it was running \$100,000 per performance but is now at \$50,000.

Mr. Rhoads asked if this appears to be an ongoing condition. Mr. Gobel stated that other legislation has been introduced proposing a different method of financing the racing commission. He added that this should take care of this type of cash flow problem in the future.

AB 648: Alters statutory provisions relating to payment and distribution of tax on pari-mutuel wagers.

Mr. Gobel stated that this legislation will allow the total takeout from the races at Henderson of four percent to go against the racing commission budget until this is fulfilled. After which the balance of the handle for the fiscal year will go to the state general fund and the City of Henderson.

Mr. Rhoads asked if the tracks began making a large profit, would it go into the general fund. Chairman Bremner stated that it would go 2/3 to the General Fund and 1/3 to Henderson in the case of the Las Vegas Downs, and in the case of any other track, it depends on the type of agreement that is reached at the beginning of operations.

UNIVERSITY OF NEVADA BUDGET

Mr. Bible distributed a handout ($\underline{\text{EXHIBIT A}}$) to the committee and discussed the subcommittee report on the University of Nevada budget.

Mr. Glover asked if the projections have an inflationary factor built into them. Mr. Bible stated that an inflationary factor is built into the figures.

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Mr. Robinson asked if any discussion was given to the requirement of the Medical School students in the State of Nevada having to practice in the State of Nevada for a certain number of years or else repay to the state the cost of their education, the same as the WICHE students. Chairman Bremner stated that no discussion was given to this matter because no other schools within the state are requried to do this with their students.

Mr. Glover asked if the subcommittee addressed the matter of getting equipment for the Fallon Community College. Chairman Bremner stated that this was not addressed because there is a bill pending addressing the matter.

Mr. Marvel moved that the subcommittee report be adopted, seconded by Mr. Hickey. The motion carried, Mr. Horn and Mr. Vergiels absent.

HIGHWAY BUDGETS

Mr. Dean Rhoads addressed the recommendations of the subcommittee with reference to the Department of Transportation. (EXHIBIT B)

Mr. Glover asked if the gas tax is increased and the Highway Department receives funds from this, will the construction program have enough staff to properly utilize the funds for road improvements since so many positions have been recommended for deletion.

Mr. Rhoads stated that the subcommittee's recommendations have been built around a budget that included the prospective gas tax increases.

Mr. Rhoads moved DO PASS on the subcommittee recommendations, seconded by Mr. Hickey. Motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Rhoads discussed the Urban Mass Transit budget for the committee, (EXHIBIT B), stating that the money can be received from the interest on the highway fund.

Mr. Rhoads moved DO PASS on the recommendation of the Urban Mass Transit Administration, seconded by Mr. Hickey. The motion carried, Mr. Glover voting no, and Mr. Vergiels absent.

The meeting was adjourned.
