The motion carried unanimously.

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
MEDICAL CARE UNIT (Pg. 588)

The Assembly Ways and Means Committee differed from the Senate Finance Committee on this budget as they provided that individual practitioner's fees will not be increased beyond the current level for the next biennium. Also, the Assembly committee required a co-payment for optional medical payments.

The Senate Committee on Finance differed from the Assembly Ways and Means Committee as they capped this budget where it could not increase more than 10% per year.
