Mr. Sparks began by explaining the problems with the 95% Rule in regard to the salaries of the unclassified employees in the Legislative Counsel Bureau.

The Committee discussed the problem of the top two classified auditor positions in the Legislative Counsel Bureau and concurred that they should be limited to a 5 percent merit increase per year instead of the budgetted increase of 10 percent per year.


