
Senator Wagner moved that the committee accept the bid from Love's Studios.

ASSEMBLY CONCURRENT RESOLUTION—Authorizing expenditure from the legislative fund to pay certain travel allowances of the members and the staff of standing committees, special committees and subcommittees of the legislature during the 61st session of the legislature.

2 *curing, That expenditure of money from the legislative fund is hereby*
3 authorized to pay:
4 1. The travel allowances provided by law for the members of stand-
5 ing committees, special committees and subcommittees of the legislature;
6 and
7 2. The travel allowances and per diem expense allowances of
8 employees of the legislature assigned to standing committees, special
9 committees or subcommittees of the legislature, for travel to and from
10 hearings or meetings of the committees during the 61st session of the leg-
11 islature when the majority leader of the senate, for a committee of the
12 senate, or the speaker of the assembly, for a committee of the assembly,
13 approves the travel.
