Mr. Robert E. Erickson, Senior Research Analyst, presented an updated report on Selected Boards, Commissions and Committees in Nevada--Public Lands and Natural Resources. Each committee member present received a chart providing general information regarding these groups, and their responsibilites and functions. (Exhibit C). Mr. Erickson referred specifically to each one of the eight boards, commissions or committees and gave limited synopses of their origin and duties.

Mr. Jac Shaw, Administrator, Division of State Lands, presented his Sagebrush Rebellion Report to the Members of the 61st Session of the Nevada Legislature (dated December 1980), as required by Assembly Bill No. 413 of the 60th Session. Copies of the report were distributed to each member of the joint hearing; a copy is on file in the secretary's office.

Mr. Shaw said he is available to answer any questions or concerns and provide any backup material in reference to this matter. He presented a brief summary of what has been achieved in regard to the "Sagebrush Rebellion" in the last eighteen months.

His summary covered, first, determination that mineral claims filed with the counties complied with the intent and wording of Assembly Bill No. 413. It is unnecessary to file mineral claims in three places, and he referred hearing members to page 25 of the report, dealing with "Regulations of the State Land Registrar Respecting Management of the Public Lands of Nevada," for comprehensive details.

Secondly, he referred to Appendix D, "Proposed Management Policy," on page 28, and said the multiple use concept shall be the basis of management of public lands in order to protect these lands for future users.

Lastly, he noted that he and Ms. Mable Hoffman, Land Use Planner for the Sagebrush Rebellion, examined and are still examining three basic categories in compiling an inventory of the public lands in the state: () land in and around urban areas; (2) lands with potentially productive irrigable soils; and (3) the remaining public domain. They shall be working closely with each county during the next several months to resolve existing issues and to develop preliminary management policies.

Mr. Shaw also used an overlay map of land use in the State of Nevada to aid in his explanation of land categories.

There was discussion between the hearing members and Mr. Shaw regarding many facets of the Sagebrush Rebellion.

Mr. Orvis Reil, speaking as an individual, was concerned about the matter of federal highway funds being withdrawn if the public lands in question are returned to the State of Nevada.

Mr. Robert Warren, representing the Nevada Mining Association, said the mining industry is totally controlled by federal law, and hoped it would be possible to clarify the language of the Sagebrush Rebellion in order that the mining law of 1872 could be perpetuated within it.

Ms. Diane Campbell, representative for the Nevada Miners and Prospectors, stated there is an obligation to look to the United States Constitution because all law is based on it, and in it. there is no provision for the federal government to hold the public lands which belong to the states.
