SUMMARY—Provides for transmittal of amendments to Tahoe Regional Planning Compact to California and corrects their effective date. (BDR S-2155)

EXPLANATION—Matter in *italics* is new; matter in brackets [] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to the Tahoe Regional Planning Compact; providing for the transmittal to California of amendments made to the compact by the 61st session of the Nevada legislature and correcting their effective date to provide for their enactment by the State of California and their approval by the Congress; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

*The People of the State of Nevada, represented in Senate and Assembly,
do enact as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 224, Statutes of Nevada 1981, is hereby
2 amended by adding thereto a new section to be designated as section 1.5,
3 which shall immediately follow section 1 and shall read as follows:

4 Sec. 1.5. The secretary of state shall transmit a certified copy of
5 section 1 of this act to the governor of the State of California, and
6 two certified copies of this entire act to the secretary of state of Cali-
7 fornia for delivery to the respective houses of its legislature. The
8 governor of this state, as soon as:

9 1. He is officially advised that the State of California has
10 enacted the amendments to the Tahoe Regional Planning Compact
11 set forth in section 1 of this act; and

12 2. The Congress of the United States has approved such
13 amendments,
14 shall proclaim that the compact has been so amended.

15 SEC. 2. Section 2 of chapter 224, Statutes of Nevada 1981, is hereby
16 amended to read as follows:

17 Sec. 2. 1. This [act] section and section 1.5 of this act shall
18 become effective upon passage and approval.

19 2. Section 1 of this act shall become effective upon proclama-
20 tion by the governor of this state of the enactment of the amend-
21 ments to the Tahoe Regional Planning Compact contained in section

1 1 of this act by the State of California and their approval by the
2 Congress of the United States.

3 SEC. 3. This act shall become effective upon passage and approval.
