

MINUTES OF THE
MEETING OF THE SENATE COMMITTEE
ON TAXATION

SIXTY-FIRST SESSION
NEVADA STATE LEGISLATURE
May 13, 1981

The Senate Committee on Taxation was called to order by Chairman Keith Ashworth, at 10:03 a.m., Wednesday, May 13, 1981, in Room 213 of the Legislative Building, Carson City, Nevada. Exhibit A is the Meeting Agenda. Exhibit B is the Attendance Roster.

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 134

The chairman asked the committee whether it wanted to reconsider its action whereby Assembly Bill No. 134 was amended.

Senator Kosinski moved that the amendments to Assembly Bill No. 134 be reconsidered.

Senator Getto seconded the motion.

The motion carried. (Senator Glaser was absent for the vote.)

The chairman asked whether the committee wanted to place a two-year moratorium on flat fee increases on the basis that flat fees are the only fees which are being increased substantially by the state.

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Senator Kosinski stated an increase in volume will result in an increase in total revenue generated by Clark County's gross revenue fee. The other counties, all of which levy a flat fee, would not be permitted any increase in revenue under the moratorium.

Senator Raggio stated he had misread the provision concerning the caps on fees in Senate Bill No. 411. He felt gaming fees could be singled out for an increase under Senate Bill No. 411.

Senator Kosinski moved that the language in Section One in the second reprint of Assembly Bill No. 134 be retained and that Section One be sunset for July 1, 1983.

Senator Don Ashworth seconded the motion.

The motion carried.

The chairman clarified that the committee is placing a moratorium on local government from increasing flat gaming fees. Clark County is prohibited from increasing the rate of its gross revenue gaming fee. Other counties are prohibited from establishing a gross gaming fee.

The chairman instructed Mr. Frank Daykin, Legislative Counsel, to draw up the amendments to the bill.

Mr. Daykin presented a Bill Draft Request for committee introduction. There were no objections to introducing the following bill:

*BDR S-2099: An act relating to the revision of statutes; making a technical correction to chapter 130, Statutes of Nevada 1981, to resolve a conflict with chapter 149, Statutes of Nevada 1981, clarifying a statutory term used in the latter; repealing a section of NRS made obsolete by chapter 60, Statutes of Nevada 1981; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

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There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at
10:15 a.m.
