MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON TRANSPORTATION

SIXTY-FIRST SESSION NEVADA STATE LEGISLATURE May 25, 1981

The Senate Committee on Transportation was called to order by Chairman Richard E. Blakemore, at 1:05 p.m., on Monday, May 25, 1981, in Room 321 of the Legislative Building, Carson City, Nevada. There was no Meeting Agenda or Attendance Roster.

Chairman Blakemore asked the committee to consider Amendment No. 1066 and Amendment No. 1142 to Senate Bill No. 52. He noted the Nevada Motor Transport Association had indicated the amendments were appropriate. The amendments would make the bill very similar to Oregon law.

Senator Bilbray moved that the committee concur with Amendment No. 1066 and Amendment No. 1142.

Senator Faiss seconded the motion.

The motion passed. (Senator Neal, Senator Hernstadt and Senator McCorkle were absent for the vote).

Chairman Blakemore asked the committee to consider Amendment No. 1116 to Senate Bill No. 444. He noted the amendments were developed by the Public Service Commission.

Senator Faiss moved that the committee concur with Amendment No. 1116.

Senate Committee on Transportation May 25, 1981

Senator Bilbray seconded the motion.

The motion passed. (Senator Neal, Senator Jacobsen and Senator McCorkle were absent for the vote).

Chairman Blakemore asked the committee to consider Amendment No. 1100 and Amendment No. 1049 to Senate Bill No. 363.

Senator Jacobsen did not concur with Amendment No. 1049 which provides for the issuance of license plates to members of the press. He felt members of the press could apply for personalized license plates.

Senator Bilbray felt the elected state officials should be given personalized license plates. Senator Jacobsen noted elected state officials can presently apply for personalized license plates.

The committee concurred with Amendment No. 1100. However, the committee did not concur with Amendment No. 1049.

SENATE BILL NO. 701

Senator Bilbray moved the bill receive a do pass recommendation.

Senator Faiss seconded the motion.

Senator Neal felt the vote should be taken at a later date when the committee would be meeting in the hearing room and the public would be more aware of the meeting.

The motion failed. (Chairman Blakemore, Senator Neal, and Senator Jacobsen voted "No"' Senator Hernstadt and Senator McCorkle were absent for the vote).

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 1:15 p.m.
