The following measures will be considered for action by the Assembly Committee on Elections, Procedures, and Ethics during a work session on Tuesday, April 1, 2003:

ASSEMBLY BILL 233

**Makes various changes concerning primary city elections and general city elections.
(BDR 24-336)**

Sponsored by: Committee on Elections, Procedures, and Ethics (on behalf of the Nevada League of Cities and Municipalities)

Discussion

Assembly Bill 233 was heard by the Committee on March 11, 2003. Mary Henderson, representing the Nevada League of Cities and Municipalities, presented the bill to the Committee. The bill authorizes the governing body of a general law city to adopt ordinances requiring that primary city elections and general city elections be held on the same dates as those established for statewide primary elections and general elections.

Proposed Conceptual Amendments

Change the word "may" to "shall" on page 2, line 4 (proposed by Mary Henderson).

ASSEMBLY BILL 328

Requires Secretary of State to submit advisory question to voters concerning regulation of sale and use of fireworks in all counties of State of Nevada. (BDR S-787)

Sponsored by: Assemblywoman Vonne Chowning

Discussion

Assembly Bill 328 was heard by the Committee on March 25, 2003. Assemblywoman Chowning presented the bill to the Committee. The bill requires the Secretary of State to submit an advisory question to voters concerning the regulation of the sale and use of fireworks in all counties of the State of Nevada.

Proposed Conceptual Amendments

In the language for the ballot question, delete the word fireworks and add the phrase "consumer fireworks (former Class C fireworks)" (proposed by Assemblywoman Giunchigliani and Dave Bowman, Assistant State Fire Marshal).
