ell users benefit from financial assistance program

n 1999, the Nevada State Legislature passed several laws to , benefit well users and further the oals of the Las Vegas Valley roundwater Management Program GMP). These laws define conditions a rell must meet before the Nevada tate Engineer can require the well ser to hook up to a municipal water upply, including failure of the existing

within 180 feet or less of the well's place of use. The Legislature also mandated a financial assistance program to help well users affected by this well connection policy in the future. The financial assistance is funded in part through the GMP annual fee assessed to all valley well users.

The Southern Nevada Water Authority (SNWA) manages and implements the financial assistance program

for domestic, community, quasi-municipal and commercial wells. Working with our area's municipal water service providers (City of Henderson, City of North Las Vegas and the Las Vegas Valley Water District), the SNWA administers grant monies generated under the GMP to provide assistance to well users hooking up to municipal service. There are three areas of assistance under the program:

- Offsite grant Offsite grant assistance is 85 percent of the total offsite construction, up to 180 feet. well and existence of municipal service
 - Onsite grant Onsite grant assistance is to establish the service between the street and the residence, or from the meter to the residence. The grant assistance is \$500 in all cases; the customer is responsible for any charges over
 - Plugging and abandonment grant Plugging and abandonment of the well is provided free of charge to the user. The SNWA has entered into a contract with a well rigger to perform all the plugging and abandonment required for this program. All well users receiving grant assistance for municipal service hookup under the GMP must plug and abandon the well previously serving the property(ies).

As of Nov. 1, 2000, 45 well users had applied for financial assistance under the GMP. While some were mandated by the Nevada State Engineer to connect to municipal water, the majority of these well owners connected voluntarily. G
