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**SUGGESTED AMENDMENT TO ASSEMBLY BILL 378
BY ASSEMBLYWOMAN SHEILA LESLIE**

EXISTING STATUTE:

NRS 424.033 Person investigated to supply fingerprints; exchange of information; report from Federal Bureau of Investigation.

1. Each applicant for a license to conduct a foster home, prospective employee of that applicant or of a person who is licensed to conduct a foster home, or resident of a foster home who is 18 years of age or older must submit to the licensing authority or its approved designee a complete set of his fingerprints and written permission authorizing the licensing authority or its approved designee to forward those fingerprints to the central repository for Nevada records of criminal history for submission to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for its report to enable the licensing authority or its approved designee to conduct an investigation pursuant to NRS 424.031.

2. The licensing authority or its approved designee may exchange with the central repository or the Federal Bureau of Investigation any information respecting the fingerprints submitted.

3. When a report from the Federal Bureau of Investigation is received by the central repository, it shall immediately forward a copy of the report to the licensing authority or its approved designee.

SUGGESTED AMENDMENT FOR ASSEMBLY BILL 378

Delete Sections 1 and 2 of the bill.

Amend NRS 424.033 by adding the following new language to subsection 3 of the statute:

3. When a report from the Federal Bureau of Investigation is received by the central repository, it shall immediately forward a copy of the report to the licensing authority or its approved *law enforcement* designee.

Amend NRS 424.033 by adding a new section as follows:

4. The licensing authority or its approved law enforcement designee may conduct Federal Bureau of Investigation Interstate Identification Index (III) name/descriptor-based checks for emergency placement of children. The licensing authority must submit two fingerprint cards to the central repository on those individuals checked using III, within the time specified by federal law. In the event any adult resident refuses to provide fingerprints to the licensing authority, the child or children placed in the home pursuant to this provision must be immediately removed from the home.
