DISCLAIMER

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§ 484.325. Right of way in crosswalk; obedience to signals and other devices for control of traffic.

Statute text

Except as provided in NRS 484.327 and 484.328:

- 1. When official traffic-control devices are not in place or not in operation the driver of a vehicle shall yield the right of way, slowing down or stopping if need be so to vield, to a pedestrian crossing the highway within a crosswalk when the pedestrian is upon the half of the highway upon which the vehicle is traveling, or when the pedestrian is approaching so closely from the opposite half of the highway as to be in danger.
- 2. A pedestrian shall not suddenly leave a curb or other place of safety and walk or run into the path of a vehicle which is so close that it is impossible for the driver to yield.
- 3. Whenever a vehicle is stopped at a marked crosswalk or at an unmarked crosswalk at an intersection, the driver of any other vehicle approaching from the rear shall not overtake and pass the stopped vehicle until the driver has determined that the vehicle being overtaken was not stopped for the purpose of permitting a pedestrian to cross the highway.
- 4. Whenever signals exhibiting the words "Walk" or "Don't Walk" are in place, such signals indicate as follows:
- (a) While the "Walk" indication is illuminated, pedestrians facing the signal may proceed across the highway in the direction of the signal and must be given the right of way by the drivers of all vehicles.
- (b) While the "Don't Walk" indication is illuminated, either steady or flashing, a pedestrian shall not start to cross the highway in the direction of the signal, but any pedestrian who has partially completed his crossing during the "Walk" indication shall proceed to a sidewalk, or to a safety zone if one is provided.
- (c) Whenever the word "Wait" still appears in a signal, the indication has the same meaning as assigned in this section to the "Don't Walk" indication.
- (d) Whenever a signal system provides a signal phase for the stopping of all vehicular traffic and the exclusive movement of pedestrians, and "Walk" and "Don't Walk" indications control pedestrian movement, pedestrians may cross in any direction between corners of the intersection offering the shortest route within the boundaries of the intersection when the "Walk" indication is exhibited, and when signals and other official traffic-control devices direct pedestrian movement in the manner provided in this section and in NRS 484,283.

Dear Officer Schulberg,

As we discussed on the telephone yesterday, the North Las Vegas Police Department does not keep statistics on events where vehicles failed to comply with the directions of a school crossing guard. Fortunately, we have had no injures or collisions resulting from such vehicles although there have been numerous "close calls" during the four and a half years I have been with the Department. This includes twice within just the last month when I had vehicles pass within 5 feet of me while I was crossing children.

The only recorded indication of the frequency of such occurrences we have is the number of the letters which we send out to the registered owners of offending vehicles when a school crossing guard is able to record the plate number.

The total number of letters sent out was: 40 during 1999; 33 during 2000; and, 24 during 2001. Few letters were sent out during 2002 and 2003 even though vehicles continue to disregard school crossing guard instructions on a regular basis.

Generally, I discourage guards from attempting to record a plate number. I would rather they focus their attentions on crossing the children safely. This relatively low number of letters does not represent an accurate picture of the number of times each month that children and school crossing guards are exposed to serious risk from vehicles passing through crossings occupied by pedestrians.
