Pursuant to an FBI contributor letter dated October 21, 2002, the added language must be included in statute for the submission of fingerprints pursuant to a county or local ordinances. The Repository has always been the sole contributor of fingerprints to the FBI. This letter is requesting that it be included in statute for the submission of fingerprints pursuant to a county or local ordinance.

239B.010 1. Any agency of the state or any political subdivision may request of and receive from the Federal Bureau of investigation information on the background and personal history of any person.

- [1.] (a) Who has applied to it for a license as required by a county or local ordinance in which (it) a county or local official has the power to grant or deny:
- [2.] (b) With whom it intends to enter into a relationship of employment or a contract for personal services: or
- [3.] (c) About whom it has a legitimate need to have accurate personal information for the protection of the agency or the people within its jurisdiction.
- 2. To request and receive information from the Federal Bureau of Investigation concerning a person pursuant to subsection l, the agency or political subdivision shall require the person to submit a complete set of his fingerprints and written permission authorizing the agency or political subdivision to forward the fingerprints to the Central Repository for Nevada Records of Criminal History for submission to the Federal Bureau of Investigations for its report.
- [3.] The Central Repository for Nevada Records of Criminal History is the State's sole contributor of fingerprints submissions and responses for fingerprint submitted to the Federal Bureau of Investigations pursuant to NRS 239B010.

OPINION ON NRS 645B.450

It is our opinion that by creating (4) would require individuals to submit fingerprint cards. By placing the fingerprint submission requirement after:
Such information or supporting materials may include, without limitation a complete set of his fingerprints and written permission authorizing
yould still allow discretionary submission to the FBI and not mandatory. It still meets the equirements of the FBI.

(4) Includes a complete set of his fingerprints and written permission authorizing the Division to forward the fingerprints to the Central Repository for Nevada records of Criminal History for submission to the Federal Bureau of Investigations for its report: and

(5) (4) Includes any other information or supporting materials required by the regulations adopted by the commissioner. Such information or supporting materials may include, without limitation a complete set of his fingerprints and written permission authorizing the Division to forward the fingerprints to the Central Repository for Nevada Records of Criminal History for submission to the Federal Bureau of Investigation for its report, the social security number of the person and other forms of identification of the person.
