TESTIMONY ON AB 188 JULIE A. SLABAUGH DEPUTY ATTORNEY GENERAL

Ī. INTRODUCTION

AB 188 seeks to amend the In Forma Pauperis Statute as it applies to inmates

incarcerated in the Nevada Department of Corrections (NDOC) and in county jails. AB 188

mirrors the procedure followed in Federal courts since the enactment of the Prison Litigation

Reform Act of 1996 (codified at 28 U.S.C. §1915). This bill would require inmates to pay the

same filing fee that a law abiding citizen has to pay in order to file a civil lawsuit in state court.

The only difference is that an inmate would be allowed to make monthly payments toward the

filing fee until it is paid in full.

Since the enactment of the PLRA in 1996 we have seen a reduction in inmate cases

handled by the Office of the Attorney General in Federal court and an increase in State court

cases. In 1995 225 new Federal inmate cases were opened by our office, in 2002 only 72 new

Federal inmate cases were opened. In contrast, in 1995 26 state court cases were opened by our

office and in 2002, 40 were opened. If small claims cases are included a total of 68 state cases

were opened.

II. **PROCEDURE**

Under AB 188 an inmate would be required to make payments towards the filing fee

based on a percentage of his inmate account balance at NDOC. Since AB 188 mirrors federal

law the NDOC already has the procedures in place to deduct the payments from an inmate's

account and submit them to the courts.

An inmate who wants to file a lawsuit would submit a Financial Certificate Request Form

to the Inmate Services Division. Inmate Services records the inmate's current account balance
