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NRS 223 Amend

Section 2: HOMELAND SECURITY

- 0 Governor appoints Advisory Committee on Homeland Security
 - any number of members
 - at least one member must not be employed or involved in law enforcement
- 0 Meetings are Open but may be closed to:
 - receive security briefings
 - discussions on
 - emergency response issues
 - mitigating vulnerabilities to acts of terrorism
 - security deficiencies to public services, infrastructure or facilities
 - consideration of matters that would create a substantial likelihood of threat to safety of the public
 - financial decision must be made in open meetings
- 0 Terrorism – any act that involves the use, threatened or attempted use of sabotage, fear or violence and intended to:
 - intimidate or coerce civilian population
 - disrupt, affect, influence conduct or policy of a governmental entity by intimidation or coercion
 - Retaliation against government – cause widespread panic or civil unrest through substantial:
 - destruction
 - contamination
 - impairment
 - disruption of:

▪ public infrastructure	transportation
▪ communications	utilities or services
▪ natural resources	environment

Section 3 REPORTING REQUIREMENT

- 0 On or before **February 15** of each year – Report from the Governor to Director LCB
 - Activities of the Homeland Security Advisory Committee to include details to:
 - Closed meetings – with explanation of why the meeting or portions of the meeting was closed
 - List of confidential records – with explanation of why the document was made confidential

NRS 242 Amend

Section 4 Confidential Records

- 0 Criteria for determining Confidential records or portions of records
 - assembled, maintained, prepared or overseen by DoIT to
 - mitigate, prevent or respond to acts of terrorism which would, if disclosed:
 - create substantial likelihood of threat to the safety of the public
 - not subject to public inspection if the record or portion of the record contains information on:
 - Infrastructure and security of information systems, including, without limitation:
 - Access codes, passwords and programs use for the security of IT Systems
 - Access codes used to security software applications
 - Procedures and process for the security of IT Systems
 - Plans to reestablish security & services of an IT system after a security breach or service interruption
 - Assessments and plans that relate specific and unique vulnerabilities of an IT system or the measures to take in response to a vulnerability, including any compiled underlying data use to prepare such assessments and plans
 - Test results of the security of IT systems, if results reveal specific vulnerabilities to an IT System
- 0 Director to maintain or cause to be maintained a list of confidential documents/records
 - list maintained to identify existence of the record/document but not the content
 - biennial review of list to determine if record/document should:
 - remain confidential
 - remove confidential identification
 - obsolete and cause the record/document to be disposed of in accordance with NRS 239
