## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Chapter 501 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2 and 3 of this act.

Sec. 2. 1. The Division may charge fees for advertising:

(a) In printed materials prepared by the Division; and

- (b) On a website on the Internet or its successor that is maintained by the Division.
- 2. Any money collected by the Division pursuant to subsection I must be:
- (a) Deposited with the State Treasurer for credit to the Wildlife Account in the State General Fund; and
- (b) Used to pay the expenses of the Division including, without 11 limitation, expenses incurred in the development, production and 12 distribution of: 13 14

(1) Printed materials prepared by the Division;

(2) Materials used by the Division on the website maintained by 16 the Division; and

- (3) Any informational and educational materials provided by the Division for the purposes described in subsection 1 of NRS 501.343.
- Sec. 3. I.—If the Division-is required or authorized by law to make reports or to publish circulars, bulletins, printed books, stationery or any other printed matter, the Division may have the printing, reproduction and binding of that printed matters

- (a) Prepared by the State Printing Division of the Department of Administration pursuant to the provisions of chapter 3 1-of NRS;

- -(b) Prepared by a printing extablishment parsum to the provisions of chapter 3.3 of NRS;
- (c) Prepared by a printing establishment pursuant to a contract submitted to competitive bidding by the Division; or

— (d) Prepared within the Division.

- 2. Any printed matter in addition to that described in subsection that is necessary for the operation of the Division, including, without limitation, brocheres, booklets, forms, blanks, envelopes and letterheads, may be prepared in any of the manners authorized in subsection L.
  - Sec. 4. NRS 344.050 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 344.050 1. The Superintendent shall not permit any other than state work to be done in the Division.
- 2. [All] Except an otherwise provided-in-caetion and directors required or authorized by law to make reports or to publish circulars, bulletins, printed books, stationery or printed matter of any kind shall:

(a) Have the printing, reproduction and binding of such material done by the Division, at the expense of their respective funds or appropriations;

(b) Produce the reports or other published matter within their respective agencies by use of copying or duplicating machines other than printing by letterpress or the offset process.

3. The printing of official stationery, cards and other material appropriate to the official duties of members of the Legislature shall be done in the Division at the expense of the Legislative Fund.

4. Invitations, tickets of admission, programs, menus or the like for any state institution or school shall not be considered state printing, and the Superintendent is directed not to accept the same but he may print such material for official state functions.

5. Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to mean that the Superintendent is required or expected to perform any work other than that which the type, machinery and other printing, reproduction and binding appliances in the Division will permit.

Sec. 5. NRS 344.140 is hereby amended to read as follows:

344.140 All officers, boards, commissioners, trustees, superintendents, regents and directors required by law to make reports to

Delete Section 3, which would have allowed for printing of reports and other publications by a printing establishment other than State Printing. All printing would continue to go through State Printing.

344.150 [A!] Except as otherwise provided in section 3 of this act, all officers, boards, commissioners, trustees, superintendents, regents and directors are required and directed to have all brochures, booklets, forms, blanks, envelopes and letterheads necessary for the successful working of the various departments, institutions and offices typeset and printed by the Division. The Superintendent is directed to accept all such work, and to execute and deliver it as promptly as possible.

Sec. 7. NRS 344.160 is hereby amended to read as follows:

344.160 1. [Should] Except are otherwise pravided by rection 3 of this art; if any state officer, commissioner, trustee or superintendent [determines] that his office, department or institution requires brochures, booklets, stationery, blanks, forms, typesetting, printing or binding which cannot be produced or performed in the Division, he shall notify the Chief of the Purchasing Division of the Department of Administration. The Chief shall, pursuant to the provisions of chapter 333 of NRS, have the work performed in a commercial printing establishment. The cost of the work must be paid out of the contingent fund provided for the expenses of state officers or out of the fund provided for the support of the commission or institution requiring the work, as the case may be.

2. The State Controller shall not draw his warrant in payment for any printed matter except such as is authorized by subsection 1.

Sec. 8. This act becomes effective on July 1, 2003.
