Good afternoon Mr. Chairman and members of the Assembly Natural Resources Committee, my name is Lloyd Nelson. I am an emission control manager with the Nevada Department of Motor Vehicles, Management Services and Programs Division.

In addition to the concerns expressed by the air quality agencies and the fiscal impact related to biennial inspection of vehicle emissions, the Department has concerns with a portion of section three of Assembly Bill 416. Under section three, lines eleven and twelve it states: "four years old or older" that have less than 36,000 miles registered on the odometer. There are many vehicles in operation that have odometers that only read up to 99,999 miles. The proposed language would exempt vehicles with such an odometer that read in excess of 99,999 miles but less than 36,000 miles. Such an exemption will very likely require a procedure requiring motorists to drive down to DMV to obtain an exemption form, based upon the odometer inspection by a department representative. This requirement has the potential to affect our current efforts of providing our customers the ability to renew their vehicle registration through Internet and telephone alternative services, without having to physically go to a DMV office.
