Thank you Mr. Chairman, Members of the Committee. I am Russ Fields,

President of the Nevada Mining Association. While AB 372 does not

directly impact the majority of members of the Mining Association, we do

believe the fundamental goal of the bill, to create a permitting program for

wildlife issues associated with renewable energy, is a worthy one.

Why would an industry be interested in promoting a regulatory or permitting

system for its projects? The answer is to provide for a level playing field for

all participants, for certainty in terms of planning and budgeting and to

demonstrate to potential financiers limits on surprises.

The mining industry found itself in a situation in the late 80's and early 90's

where we indeed needed a rational permitting system to ensure wildlife was

protected around our mining and processing operations. At that time, the
