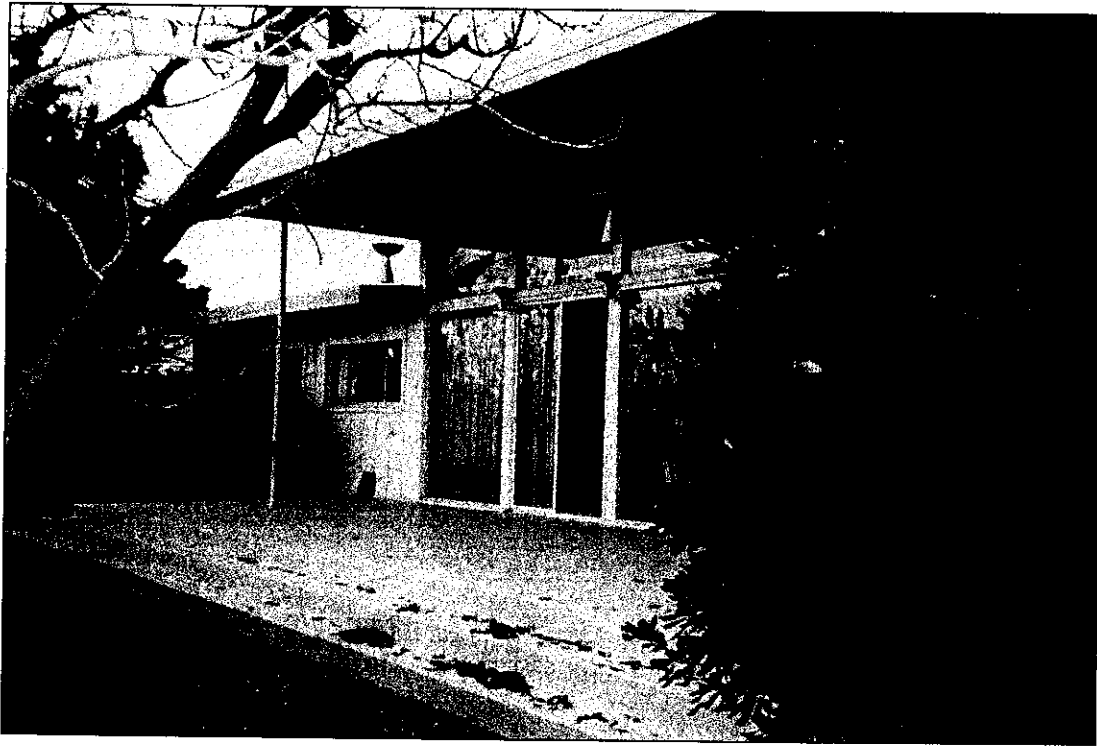

With assistance from the Commission, Virginia City's Fourth Ward School has become a nationally recognized institution. Nearly a million visitors have benefited from its programming.

With Commission grants, the Western Folklife Center in Elko has turned its Pioneer Hotel into an internationally-famous venue.





The Morelli House will serve as a cultural center for the Junior League of Las Vegas. The house is situated on land purchased for the relocation of the Whitehead House that was destroyed by fire.



In 2001, the Lander County Historical Society relocated the historic 25 Ranch's cookhouse to Battle Mountain where it will house a museum and cultural center. Today Commission funds are helping the Society to realize its goal
