Proposed Amendment to Assembly Bill No. 441 (First Reprint) by Speaker Perkins

- 1) Amend the definition of "information system" in section 8 of the bill to clarify that the term applies only to computer software, procedures or technology which is related to homeland security. This was requested by law enforcement.
- 2) Amend section 21 of the bill concerning confidential documents to provide penalties for unauthorized disclosure of such confidential documents which are the same as the penalties for the unauthorized disclosure of confidential documents set forth in subsection 5 of section 27 of the bill. This was requested by Southwest Gas.
- 3) Amend subsection 3 of section 26 to allow the Legislature to call itself into special session to elect a new Governor if there is a vacancy in the Office of Governor and none of the successors are able or available to act as a result of a catastrophic emergency. This was requested by Janine Hansen, Nevada Eagle Forum.
- 4) Amend sections 30 and 31 of the bill to remove any reference to components of an information system. This was requested by law enforcement.
- 5) Add an appropriation to support the operation of the Commission on Homeland Security. This was requested by the Governor, per Michael Hillerby, Deputy Chief of Staff. The recommended amount of the appropriation is \$118,750 in FY 2003-2004 and \$111,069 in FY 2004-2005.
- 6) Amend section 40 to provide that sections 34 to 37, inclusive, of the bill become effective on January 1, 2004. This was requested by Clay Thomas of the Department of Motor Vehicles.
