## **Organizational Input**

The bill creates a construction defect commission under the NSCB but the members receive no compensation other than travel expenses paid out of the Residential Recovery Fund. The recovery fund is a legally restricted revenue fund used solely to compensate homeowners who are injured by the acts of a residential contractor. The proposed commission would need support staff and professionals, to include: court reporters, three attorneys, legal staff and related office and investigative staff, office space, computers, equipment, and vehicles. Clark County currently has 3 full time judges and approximately 5 staff each dealing with construction defect cases. The commission would handle approximately 225 new class action cases per year, not including individual homeowner complaints. The estimated cost for initial set up is \$4.1 million the first year and 2.9 million for FY 2004-05. The cost of retaining expert witnesses is an estimate. Current cases is
