STATEMENT TO THE NEVADA STATE LEGISLATIVE SENATE COMMERCE AND LABOR COMMITTEE ON AB79 EXTERNAL REVIEW

My name is Ruth Mills. I am president of the board of the Nevada Health Care Reform Project. Our project will be ten years old this year. We started with about a dozen organizations organized by the League of Women Voters and now have approximately one hundred member organizations representing over one half million Nevadans. We recently welcomed the Nevada Alliance for Retired Americans and the Nevada Association of Social Workers.

We are a coalition of consumers, organized labor, seniors, disability groups, religious organizations and health care professionals. Our mission is to assure all Nevadans comprehensive and affordable health care coverage and improve the quality of health care.

As the last part of the Patient Protection Act you enacted six years ago we have written legislation, AB79 to further protect the individual with an external review of their situation in the event they are denied insurance coverage. It minimizes the need for law suits to resolve conflict. Thirty-four states already have such legislation and the Nevada insurance industry has agreed it is necessary.

It is our understanding that we have negotiated any differences we may have had with the insurance industry over this legislation and are now united in our request for acceptance of AB 79.

Nevada's health care needs are numerous and we face many challenges in meeting those needs. This bill is one step in the right direction toward insuring the quality of health care in our state. We look forward to working with the committee on the other health care issues we face.

Please pass AB79.
