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

Senate Bill 191 - Revised Fiscal Note

During the April 3, 2003 hearing on Senate Bill 191, the Committee requested that school districts again review submitted fiscal notes for accuracy, and base any revisions to the fiscal notes on proposed amendments to the bill. In response to the Committee's request, representatives of the school districts met with staff to review the proposed amendments to Senate Bill 191 and subsequently have provided a revised fiscal note (see attached). The following table summarizes total statewide costs Senate Bill 191, as provided by school districts:
