Review of NDOW's amendments to S.B. 420 (fee increase)

Gary, I have reviewed NDOW's recommended amendments to S.B. 420 submitted on May 9, 2003. NDOW's revision eliminates all references to CPI adjustments that projects revenue reductions of \$180,426 in FY 2005. The revision also eliminates the proposal to assess fees to Native Americans and Disabled Veterans, and maintains the existing \$5 fee for Armed Forces residents not stationed in Nevada. These fee changes reduces projected revenues by \$19,115 in FY 2004 and \$38,435 in FY 2005. NDOW proposes to restore the reduced revenues with additional fee increase of \$2 for resident hunting/fishing combination licenses; \$2 for nonresident annual fishing licenses; and \$3 for nonresident 1-day hunting or fishing licenses with an additional \$1 for each consecutive day. The additional fee increases are projected to generate additional revenues of \$85,137 in FY 2004 and \$179,558 in FY 2005.

The worksheets submitted by NDOW calculating revenue increases do not appear to include an adjustment for reductions in licenses sold due to pricing changes. S.B. 420 provides for all hunting, fishing and related fee increases to be effective March 1, 2004 as originally proposed. Boat titling, registration, and replacement document fee increases are effective January 1, 2004.

- 1. Removal of the Consumer Price Index (CPI)
- Increases the following fees to compensate for the loss of CPI
 - (a) Resident Combination Hunting/Fishing from \$48 to \$50
 - (b) Nonresident Annual Fishing from \$63 to \$65
- (c) Nonresident Short-term Upland Game/Waterfowl Hunting 1-day Permit from \$17 to \$20 and each added consecutive day from \$7 to \$8
- (d) Nonresident Short-term Fishing 1-day Permit from \$14 to \$17 and each added consecutive day from \$6 to \$7

Steve Bremer and Dave Hansen have prepared new spreadsheets with the effects of the changes which are also attached.
