A birth parent may at any time request from the State Registrar of 8 Vital Statistics a contact preference form and medical history form that 9 shall accompany a birth certificate issued under section 1 of this statute. 10 The contact preference form shall provide the following information to be 11 completed at the option of the birth parent: 12 (1) I would like to be contacted. 13 (2) I would prefer to be contacted only through an intermediary. 14 (3) I prefer not to be contacted at this time. If I decide later that I would 15 like to be contacted, I will submit an updated contact preference form to 16 the State Registrar of Vital Statistics. I have completed an updated medical 17 history form and have filed it with the State Registrar of Vital Statistics. 18 The medical history form shall be in a form prescribed by the Department 19 of Vital Statistics and shall be supplied to the birth parent upon request of 20 a contact preference form from the State Registrar of Vital Statistics. 21 Only those persons who are authorized to process applications made under 22 section 1 of this section may process contact preference and medical 23 history forms. 24 The medical history form and contact preference form are confidential 25 communications from the birth parent to the person named on the sealed 26 birth certificate and shall be placed in a sealed envelope upon receipt from 27 the birth parent. The sealed envelope shall be matched with and placed in 28 the file containing the sealed birth certificate. 29 The sealed envelope containing the contact preference form and medical 30 history form shall be released to a person requesting his or her own 31 original birth certificate under section 1 of this section. The contact 32 preference form and medical history form are a private communication 33 from the birth parent to the person named on the sealed birth certificate and no copies of the forms shall be retained by the State Registrar of Vital

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Statistics.

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NRS 440.700 Fees for services and copies of certificates; certificates available without fee.

1. The state registrar shall charge and collect the following fees:

For searching the files for one name, if no copy is made
For verifying a vital record8
For establishing and filing a record of paternity (other than a hospital-based paternity),
and providing a certified copy of the new record
For a certified copy of a record of birth
For a certified copy of a record of death
For correcting a record on file with the state registrar and providing a certified copy of the corrected record
For replacing a record on file with the state registrar and providing a certified copy of the new record
For filing a delayed certificate of birth and providing a certified copy of the certificate 20
For the services of a notary public, provided by the state registrar
For an index of records of marriage provided on microfiche to a person other than a
county recorder of a county of this state
For an index of records of divorce provided on microfiche to a person other than a county recorder of a county in this state
For compiling data files which require specific changes in computer programming 200 For filing of a Contact Preference Form and Medical History Form

- 2. The fee collected for furnishing a copy of a certificate of birth or death must include the sum of \$3 for credit to the children's trust account.
- 3. Upon the request of any parent or guardian, the state registrar shall supply, without the payment of a fee, a certificate limited to a statement as to the date of birth of any child as disclosed by the record of such birth when the certificate is necessary for admission to school or for securing employment.
- 4. The United States Bureau of the Census may obtain, without expense to the state, transcripts or certified copies of births and deaths without payment of a fee.
