SECOND REVISED AGENDA

- S.B. 334 Authorizes metropolitan police committees on fiscal affairs to submit to voters question of imposition of additional ad valorem tax for support of metropolitan police department. (BDR 22-895)
- S.B. 440 Provides for postponement of payment of property taxes in cases of severe economic hardship under certain circumstances. (BDR 32-658)
- S.B. 468 Revises limitation on total ad valorem tax levy. (BDR 32-625)
- S.B. 472 Establishes method for determining total percentage of permanent service-related disability for purposes of calculating disabled veteran's exemption from property tax. (BDR 32-523)
- S.B. 475 Revises manner of assessing value of certain electric light and power companies. (BDR 32-1242)
