BDR 19-1139 is an anti-terrorism bill that creates a Nevada Commission on Homeland Security. NCHS would establish plans and make vulnerability assessments. This bill would create/enhance a number of penalties for unautherized disclosure of information and for falsely obtaining a Nevada Driver's Permit. If a person knowingly and unlawfully discloses information regarding planning or vulnerability assessments for the purpose of committing, aiding, or concealing an unlawful act of terrorism they could be sentenced to a Class C felony. Further, if a person sells, transfers, or possesses a document or identifying information for the purpose of establishing a false status, occupation, membership, liscense or idenity they would be subject to a Class E felony. If they impersonate an officer or employee of a utility to commit or attempt to commit an unlawful act with the purpose of comitting, aiding, concealing an act of terrorism they may be convicted of a Class C felony. If a person uses a false name or knowingly makes a false statement or conceals a material fact to obtain a driver's license is guilty of a Class E felony.

NDOC research staff is unable to accurately determine the number and timing of new inmates that would be sentenced under this bill. There is no historical information that would provide accurate insight into the number of times individuals would commit these crimes. Staff cannot estimate the bill's impact on future NDOC inmate population nor its impact on the department's budget.
