AN ACT relating to pupils; repealing the prohibition against pupils carrying or possessing any electronic device used for paging or communication while on school grounds; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. NRS 392.930 is hereby repealed.

TEXT OF REPEALED SECTION

392.930 Carrying or possessing on school grounds electronic device for paging or communication; exceptions.

1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, it is unlawful for a pupil in kindergarten or grades 1 to 12, inclusive, while on school grounds, to carry or possess a beeper, portable telephone or any other similar electronic device designed to page or contact a person.



 A pupil may carry or possess a beeper, portable telephone or other similar device on school grounds if he is expressly authorized in writing to do so by the school administrator.
As used in this section, "beeper" means a portable electronic device which is used to page the person carrying it by emitting an audible or a vibrating signal when the device receives a special radio signal.
