AN ACT relating to the administration of public agencies; increasing the maximum amount that may be maintained in a petty cash account of a state agency; allowing the State Board of Examiners to authorize its clerk to determine whether an emergency exists and approve an expenditure from the Emergency Account in the State General Fund; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. NRS 353.252 is hereby amended to read as follows: 353.252 1. The State Board of Examiners may authorize its clerk, under such circumstances as it deems appropriate, to authorize a state agency to establish a petty cash account of not more than [\$250] \$500 out of the agency's budgeted resources.

6 2. If a petty cash account is authorized for any state agency 7 pursuant to this section, the clerk shall:

8 (a) Define the purposes for which the petty cash account may be 9 used; and



1 (b) Provide that replenishment claims must be paid from the 2 agency's budgeted resources and processed as other claims against 3 the State are paid.

Sec. 2. NRS 353.263 is hereby amended to read as follows:

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5 353.263 1. As used in this section, "emergency" means 6 invasion, disaster, insurrection, riot, breach of the peace, substantial 7 threat to life or property, epidemic or the imminent danger thereof. 8 The term includes damage to or the disintegration of a building 9 owned by this state or of the mechanical or electrical system of such 10 a building when immediate repairs are necessary to maintain the 11 integrity of the structure or its mechanical or electrical system.

12 2. The Emergency Account is hereby created in the State13 General Fund. Money for the Account must be provided by direct14 legislative appropriation.

3. When the State Board of Examiners finds that an emergency exists which requires an expenditure for which no appropriation has been made, or in excess of an appropriation made, the Board may authorize an expenditure from the Emergency Account to meet the emergency.

20 4. The State Board of Examiners may, under such 21 circumstances as it deems appropriate, authorize its clerk to 22 determine whether an emergency exists and approve, on behalf of 23 the Board, an expenditure from the Emergency Account.

5. The Chief shall enumerate expenditures from the Account made in the preceding biennium in each executive budget report.
