SUMMARY-Exempts certain sports officials from certain provisions governing compensation. (BDR 53-1110)

AN ACT relating to compensation; excluding certain sports officials from the payment of unemployment compensation or workers' compensation; excluding certain sports officials from participation in the Public Employees' Retirement System; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Chapter 612 of NRS is hereby amended by adding 1 2 thereto a new section to read as follows:

1. "Employment" does not include service performed while 3 4 officiating a sporting event by a person who acts as a sports 5 official if: 6

- (a) The person is paid a nominal fee for his service; and
- (b) The sporting event is:

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(1) Amateur, intercollegiate or interscholastic; and

9 (2) Sponsored by a public agency, public entity or private, 10 nonprofit organization.

2. As used in this section, "sports official" includes an 11 umpire, referee, judge, scorekeeper, timekeeper or other person 12 who is a neutral participant in a sporting event. 13

referee, judge, scorekeeper, timekeeper or other person who is a
neutral participant in a sports event.

Sec. 6. NRS 286.016 is hereby amended to read as follows:

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10 286.016 As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise 11 requires, the words and terms defined in NRS 286.017 to 286.100, 12 inclusive, *and section 5 of this act* have the meanings ascribed to 13 them in [such] *those* sections.

Sec. 7. NRS 286.297 is hereby amended to read as follows:

15 286.297 The following persons are not eligible to become 16 members of the System:

17 1. Inmates of state institutions even though they may be 18 receiving compensation for services performed for the institution.

19 2. Independent contractors or persons rendering professional 20 services on a fee, retainer or contract basis.

4. Except as otherwise provided in NRS 286.525, persons retired under the provisions of this chapter who are employed by a participating public employer.

Members of boards or commissions of the State of Nevada or of its political subdivisions when **[such]** *the* boards or commissions are advisory or directive and when membership thereon is not compensated except for expenses incurred. Receipt of a fee for attendance at official sessions of a particular board or commission does not constitute compensation for the purpose of this subsection.

34 [6.] 7. District judges and justices of the Supreme Court first
35 elected or appointed on or after July 1, 1977, who are not enrolled in
36 the System at the time of election or appointment.

 38 Community College System of Nevada who are employed on or
 39 after July 1, 1977.

40 [8.] 9. Persons employed on or after July 1, 1979, under the 41 Comprehensive Employment and Training Act.

42 [9.] 10. Except as otherwise provided in NRS 286.293, persons 43 assigned to intermittent or temporary positions unless the 44 assignment exceeds 6 consecutive months.



[10.] 11. Persons employed on or after July 1, 1981, as part-time guards at school crossings.
[11.] 12. Nurses who:

(a) Are not full-time employees;
(b) Are paid an hourly wage on a daily basis;
(c) Do not receive the employee benefits received by other employees of the same employer; and
(d) Do not work a regular schedule or are requested to work for a shift at a time.
