AN ACT relating to Oriental medicine; revising the qualifications for members of the State Board of Oriental Medicine; revising the requirements for a license to practice Oriental medicine; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** NRS 634A.030 is hereby amended to read as 2 follows:

3 634A.030 1. The State Board of Oriental Medicine, 4 consisting of five members appointed by the Governor, is hereby 5 created.

6 2. [The Governor shall appoint to the Board:

7 <u>(a) Three members who are licensed pursuant to this chapter.</u>

8 (b) Two members who are representatives of the general public.

9 -3.] Each member of the Board shall, before entering upon the 10 duties of his office, take the oath of office prescribed by the 11 Constitution before someone qualified to administer oaths.

14 1. The Governor shall appoint three members to the Board 15 who:

16 (a) Have a license issued pursuant to this chapter;



1 (b) Do not have a license in this state to practice any healing 2 art other than Oriental medicine; (c) Have received a degree from a school or college of Oriental 3 *medicine that is approved by the Board;* 4 (d) Currently engage in the practice of Oriental medicine in 5 this state, and have engaged in the practice of Oriental medicine 6 7 in this state for at least 3 years preceding appointment to the 8 **Board**: 9 (e) Are citizens of the United States; and 10 (f) Are residents of the State of Nevada H and have been for at least 1 year preceding appointment to the Board. 11 2. The Governor shall appoint one member to the Board who: 12 13 (a) Is licensed pursuant to chapter 630 of NRS by the Board of 14 Medical Examiners as a physician; (b) Does not engage in the administration of a facility for 15 Oriental medicine or a school for Oriental medicine; 16 (c) Does not have a pecuniary interest in any matter pertaining 17 to Oriental medicine, except as a patient or potential patient; 18 19 (d) Is a citizen of the United States; and 20 (e) Is a resident of the State of Nevada and has been for at 21 least 1 year preceding appointment to the Board. 22 3. The Governor shall appoint one member to the Board who: (a) Does not engage in the administration of a facility for 23 24 Oriental medicine or a school for Oriental medicine; 25 (b) Does not have a pecuniary interest in any matter pertaining to Oriental medicine, except as a patient or potential patient; 26 27 (c) Is a citizen of the United States; and 28 (d) Is a resident of the State of Nevada and has been for at 29 least 1 year preceding appointment to the Board. 30 **Sec. 3.** NRS 634A.120 is hereby amended to read as follows: 31 634A.120 1. Each applicant for a license to practice as a doctor of Oriental medicine must pass: 32 33 (a) An examination in Oriental medicine that is administered by a national organization approved by the Board; and 34 35 (b) A practical examination approved by the Board that tests the applicant's knowledge and understanding of [the]: 36 37 (1) Basic medical science; 38 (2) Acupuncture; (3) Herbal medicine: 39 40 (4) Oriental medicine; 41 (5) English proficiency; and 42 (6) The laws and regulations of this state relating to health 43 and safety in the practice of Oriental medicine.

44 2. The Board may establish by regulation:



(a) Additional subject areas to be included in the practical 1 2 examination; and

(b) Specific methods for the administration of the practical 3 examination, including, but not limited to, written, oral, demonstrative, practical or any combination thereof. 4 5

3. The Board shall contract for the preparation, administration 6 7 and grading of the practical examination.

 $\begin{bmatrix} 2 \\ - \end{bmatrix}$  4. Except as otherwise provided in subsection  $\begin{bmatrix} 3 \\ - \end{bmatrix}$  5, the 8 9 Board shall offer the practical examination at least two times each 10 year at a time and place established by the Board.

[3.] 5. The Board may cancel a scheduled practical examination if, within 60 days before the examination, the Board 11 12 has not received a request to take the examination. 13

[4.] 6. A person who fails the practical examination may 14 15 retake the examination.

16 Sec. 4. Notwithstanding the amendatory provisions of sections

1 and 2 of this act, each person serving as a member of the State 17

Board of Oriental Medicine on October 1, 2003, may continue to 18 19

serve until the expiration of his term.
