EXPLANATION - Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to education; authorizing drivers of school buses to remove the privilege of disruptive pupils to ride a school bus; requiring boards of trustees of school districts to establish certain committees to review the removal of the privilege of a pupil to ride a school bus; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Chapter 392 of NRS is hereby amended by adding 2 thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2 to 5, inclusive, of this 3 act.

4 Sec. 2. 1. A driver of a school bus may remove the privilege 5 of a pupil to ride any school bus if, in the judgment of the driver, 6 the pupil has engaged in behavior while on the school bus that is 7 disruptive and threatens the safety of the driver or the other pupils 8 on the school bus, or both, or otherwise seriously interferes with

9 the ability of the driver to drive the school bus.



1 2. Before a driver of a school bus removes the privilege of a 2 pupil to ride a school bus, the driver shall:

3 (a) Provide to the pupil an explanation of the reason for the 4 removal and offer an opportunity for the pupil to respond;

5 (b) Safely deliver the pupil to the regular bus stop of the pupil 6 or the school in which the pupil is enrolled; and

7 (c) Provide written documentation of the incident to the 8 principal of the school in which the pupil is enrolled.

9 3. Within 24 hours after a driver of a school bus removes the 10 privilege of a pupil to ride a school bus, the principal of the school 11 in which the pupil is enrolled shall notify:

12 (a) The parent or legal guardian of the pupil; and

(b) The person who supervises the driver.

14 Sec. 3. 1. Except as otherwise provided in this section, not 15 later than 5 school days after the privilege of a pupil to ride a 16 school bus is removed pursuant to section 2 of this act, a 17 conference must be held with:

18 (a) The pupil;

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19 (b) A parent or legal guardian of the pupil;

20 (c) The principal of the school; and

(d) The driver who removed the pupil.

22 2. The principal shall give an oral or written notice of the 23 conference, as appropriate, to each person who is required to 24 participate. The pupil is prohibited from riding any school bus 25 before the conference is held. If the conference is not held during 26 the regular work hours of the driver of the school bus, the driver 27 must be paid additional compensation for his attendance at the 28 conference.

29 3. After receipt of the notice required pursuant to subsection 30 2, the parent or legal guardian of the pupil may, not later than 5 31 school days after the removal of the pupil, request that the date of the conference be postponed. The principal shall accommodate 32 33 such a request. If the date of the conference is postponed pursuant to this subsection, the principal shall send written notice to the 34 parent or legal guardian confirming that the conference has been 35 postponed at the request of the parent or legal guardian. 36

37 4. If a parent or legal guardian of a pupil refuses to attend a 38 conference, the principal of the school shall send a written notice 39 to the parent or legal guardian to confirm that the parent or legal 40 guardian has intentionally waived the right to a conference 41 provided by this section and has thereby authorized the principal 42 at his discretion to recommend the immediate return of the 43 privilege of the pupil to ride the school bus or to recommend the 44 removal of the privilege of the pupil to ride the school bus for 5 school days in addition to the days that the pupil has been 45



1 prohibited from riding the school bus pursuant to section 2 of this 2 act.

3 5. During the conference, the driver of the school bus who removed the privilege of the pupil to ride the school bus or the 4 principal shall provide the pupil and his parent or legal guardian 5 with an explanation of the reason for the removal. The pupil and 6 7 his parent or legal guardian must be granted an opportunity to 8 respond to the explanation and to indicate whether the removal of 9 the privilege of the pupil to ride the school bus was appropriate in 10 their opinion based upon the behavior of the pupil.

6. Upon conclusion of the conference or, if a conference is 11 not held pursuant to subsection 4, not later than 5 school days 12 13 after the removal of the privilege of the pupil to ride the school 14 bus, the principal shall recommend whether to immediately return 15 the privilege of the pupil to ride the school bus or to remove the privilege of the pupil to ride the school bus for 5 school days in 16 addition to the days that the pupil has been prohibited from riding 17 the school bus pursuant to section 2 of this act. 18

19 Sec. 4. 1. The board of trustees of each school district shall 20 establish a special committee on school bus transportation to 21 review the removal of the privilege of a pupil to ride a school bus. 22 Such a committee must consist of:

23 (a) One person employed by the school district who drives a 24 school bus. If an employee organization or association represents 25 the school bus drivers within the school district, that organization or association shall appoint the member pursuant to this 26 27 paragraph.

28 (b) One person employed by the school district as an 29 administrator. An administrator who is appointed pursuant to this 30 paragraph may designate a person who is employed by the school 31 district as a supervisor of school bus transportation to serve in the 32 administrator's place on the committee. 33

(c) One person employed by the school district as a teacher.

34 (d) One additional member who drives a school bus to serve as 35 an alternate member. If an employee organization or association represents the school bus drivers within the school district, that 36 organization or association shall appoint the member pursuant to 37 38 this paragraph.

39 2. If the privilege of a pupil to ride a school bus is removed 40 pursuant to section 2 of this act by a driver who is a member of the 41 committee established pursuant to subsection 1, the driver shall 42 not participate in the review of the removal of the pupil's privilege 43 to ride the school bus and the alternate member shall serve on the 44 committee for that review.



Sec. 5. If, in accordance with subsection 6 of section 3 of this 1 2 act, the principal recommends that the privilege of the pupil to ride the school bus be immediately returned and the driver who 3 4 removed the pupil does not agree with the recommendation, the 5 principal shall immediately convene a meeting of the committee created pursuant to section 4 of this act. The principal shall 6 inform the parent or legal guardian of the pupil that the 7 committee will be conducting a meeting. The committee shall 8 9 review the circumstances of the removal of the pupil's privilege to 10 ride the school bus and the pupil's behavior that caused the privilege to be removed. Based upon its review, the committee shall 11 decide whether the privilege of the pupil to ride the school bus 12 must be immediately returned or whether the privilege should be 13 removed for 5 school days in addition to the days the pupil has 14 15 been prohibited from riding the school bus pursuant to section 2 16 of this act. 17 Sec. 6. This act becomes effective on July 1, 2003.

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
