AN ACT relating to elections; providing a Voters' Bill of Rights; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Chapter 293 of NRS is hereby amended by adding
thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2, 3 and 4 of this act.
Sec. 2. Section 3 of this act may be cited as the Voters' Bill of

Sec. 2. Section 3 of this act may be cited as the Voters' Bill of Rights.

5 Sec. 3. The Legislature hereby declares that each voter has 6 the right:

1. To receive and cast a ballot that:

8 (a) Is written in a format that allows the clear identification of 9 candidates; and

10 (b) Accurately records the voter's preference in the selection of 11 candidates.

12 2. To have his questions concerning voting procedures 13 answered and to have an explanation of the procedures for voting 14 posted in a conspicuous place at the polling place.

15 3. To vote without being intimidated, threatened or coerced.

16 4. To vote on election day if the voter is waiting in line at his 17 polling place to vote before 7 p.m. and he has not already cast his 18 vote in that election.



1 5. To return a spoiled ballot and is entitled to receive another 2 ballot in its place.

6. To request assistance in voting, if necessary.

4 7. To a sample ballot which is accurate, informative and 5 delivered in a timely manner.

6 8. To receive instruction in the use of the equipment for 7 voting during early voting or on election day.

8 9. To have nondiscriminatory equal access to the elections 9 system, including, without limitation, a voter who is elderly, 10 disabled, a member of a minority group, employed by the military 11 or a citizen who is overseas.

12 10. To have a uniform, statewide standard for counting and 13 recounting all votes accurately.

14 **11.** To have complaints about elections and election contests 15 resolved fairly, accurately and efficiently.

16 Sec. 4. 1. The Secretary of State, each county clerk and 17 each city clerk shall:

18 (a) Make the Voters' Bill of Rights readily available to the 19 public;

20 (b) Maintain a copy of the Voters' Bill of Rights in his office 21 for reproduction and distribution to the public; and

22 (c) Ensure that the Voters' Bill of Rights is posted in a 23 conspicuous place, in at least 12-point type, at each polling place.

24 2. The Secretary of State shall ensure that the Voters' Bill of 25 Rights is posted on his Internet website.

26 Sec. 5. The provisions of NRS 354.599 do not apply to any 27 additional expenses of a local government that are related to the 28 provisions of this act.
