AN ACT relating to education; prohibiting an employee or agent of a school district from taking certain actions relating to the use of psychotropic drugs by pupils; authorizing certain employees of a school district to suggest that a pupil be evaluated for placement in a special program; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- **Section 1.** Chapter 392 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:
- 1. A person who is an employee or agent of a school district 4 shall not:
- (a) Suggest to a pupil or to a parent or guardian of a pupil that 5 the pupil should take a psychotropic drug unless the person is a physician; or



- (b) Require a pupil to take a psychotropic drug as a condition of attending class.
- 2. A person who is an employee or agent of a school district may suggest that a pupil be evaluated for determination of whether the pupil should be placed in a special program pursuant to NRS 388.470.

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- 3. As used in this section:

  (a) "Physician" means a person who is licensed to practice medicine as a physician pursuant to chapter 630 of NRS.

  (b) "Psychotropic drug" means a controlled substance listed in schedule II by the State Board of Pharmacy pursuant to NRS 453.146. 12
  - Sec. 2. This act becomes effective on July 1, 2003.
