- SUMMARY—Requires libraries in public high schools to be open to general public. (BDR 34-1307)

EXPLANATION - Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to public schools; requiring the boards of trustees of school districts to make the libraries in public high schools open to the general public during certain times that are not regular school hours; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 393 of NRS is hereby amended by adding 2 thereto a new section to read as follows:

3 1. The board of trustees of each school district shall ensure 4 that each library in each public high school located within the 5 school district is open to the general public on a year-round basis 6 and during certain times that are not regular school hours.

7 2. Each library in a public high school must be open to the 8 general public during the following times:

9 (a) On each weekday during the school year when school is in 10 session, from the time at which the school day ends until 7 p.m.

- 11 (b) On each weekday during the summer, or between sessions 12 in schools with year-round schedules, for a period of at least 4 13 hours.
- 14 (c) On each weekend day during the year, for a period of at 15 least 4 hours.



1 3. Each public high school shall post the hours set forth in 2 subsection 2 in a manner that informs the general public of the 3 times that the library is available for use by the general public.

4 4. A member of the general public who possesses a library
5 card issued by a public library, as that term is defined in NRS
6 379.0057, may use that library card to check out books at a high
7 school library that is open to the general public.

8 5. The board of trustees of a school district may enter into 9 one or more cooperative agreements with:

10 (a) The trustees of a consolidated, county, district, town or 11 other public library located within the county in which the school 12 district is located; and

(b) The governing authority of a city library located within the
 county in which the school district is located,

for the provision of library personnel and resources for a library
in a public high school located within the school district that is
open to the general public pursuant to this section.

Sec. 2. NRS 393.071 is hereby amended to read as follows:

19 393.071 The board of trustees of any school district may grant 20 the use of school buildings or grounds for public, literary, scientific, 21 recreational or educational meetings [,] or for the discussion of 22 matters of general or public interest upon such terms and conditions 23 as the board deems proper, subject to the limitations, requirements 24 and restrictions set forth in NRS 393.071 to 393.0719, inclusive [.], 25 and section 1 of this act.

Sec. 3. NRS 393.0713 is hereby amended to read as follows:
393.0713 [No]

Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, the privilege
 of using the buildings or grounds [shall] *must not* be granted for a
 period exceeding 1 year. The privilege is renewable and revocable
 in the discretion of the board *of trustees* at any time.

2. The time limitation set forth in subsection 1 does not apply to the use of a high school library pursuant to section 1 of this act.

34 Sec. 4. NRS 393.0714 is hereby amended to read as follows:

35 393.0714 The board of trustees of any school district may grant 36 the use of school buildings, grounds and equipment without charge 37 to [public] :

Public agencies for the purpose of holding examinations for
 the selection of personnel.

40 2. The general public for use of the libraries in high schools 41 located within the school district pursuant to section 1 of this act.

42 **Sec. 5.** NRS 393.0719 is hereby amended to read as follows: 43 393.0719 *I*. Lighting, heating, *fianitor janitorial* service and

the services of the person referred to in NRS 393.0718, when needed, and other necessary expenses, in connection with the use of



public school buildings and grounds pursuant to NRS 393.071 to
 393.0719, inclusive, [shall] and section 1 of this act must be
 provided for out of school district funds of the respective school
 districts in the same manner as similar services are provided for,
 and except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, subject to
 reimbursement by the user in accordance with such policies and
 regulations as the board of trustees may adopt.
 The board of trustees of a school district may not request
 reimbursement for the costs and expenses associated with the use

- 11 section 1 of this act.
- 12 Sec. 6. This act becomes effective on July 1, 2003.
