ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 353-ASSEMBLYWOMAN GIUNCHIGLIANI

SUMMARY—Makes various changes to provisions regarding University and Community College System of Nevada and Board of Regents of University of Nevada. (BDR 34-76)

EXPLANATION - Matter in **bolded italics** is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to the University and Community College System of Nevada; providing in skeleton form for a reduction in the size of the Board of Regents; providing for the informed consent of a student enrolled in a university, state college or community college within the System concerning the public disclosure of personally identifiable information concerning the student; providing that a student may prohibit the disclosure of personally identifiable information for commercial or noncommercial uses, or both; requiring the System to provide certain informational seminars to the Board of Regents of the University of Nevada; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Chapter 396 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2 and 3 of this act.

Sec. 2. 1. The Board of Regents shall prescribe a form that provides for the informed consent of students concerning the directory information that a university, university foundation, state college or community college, as applicable, makes public. The form must:



- (a) Allow each student a reasonable opportunity to indicate whether the student opts not to authorize the release or disclosure of personally identifiable information concerning the student for:
- (1) Commercial purposes, without the prior written consent of the student;
- (2) Noncommercial purposes, without the prior written consent of the student; or
- (3) Both commercial and noncommercial purposes, without the prior written consent of the student.
 - (b) Inform the student that:

- (1) If he does not return the form indicating that his personally identifiable information must not be released or disclosed, then it is probable that the information will be released or disclosed.
- (2) If he returns the form indicating that his personally identifiable information must not be released or disclosed, then the university, university foundation, state college or community college, as applicable, will not release or disclose the information without his prior written consent.
- (c) Be included with the other forms required for admission to the university, state college or community college, as applicable.
- 2. A university, university foundation, state college or community college shall not release, disclose or otherwise use any personally identifiable information concerning a student without the prior written consent of the student for:
- (a) Commercial or noncommercial purposes if the student has returned a form indicating that he does not authorize release or disclosure for those purposes without his consent;
- (b) Commercial purposes if the student has returned a form indicating that he does not authorize release or disclosure for those purposes without his consent; or
- (c) Noncommercial purposes if the student has returned a form indicating that he does not authorize release or disclosure for those purposes.
 - 3. As used in this section:
- (a) "Directory information" has the meaning ascribed to it in $20 \text{ U.S.C.} \ \S 1232g(a)(5)(A)$.
- (b) "Personally identifiable information" means information that may be used to identify a person, including, without limitation, the name, address, telephone number, date of birth, and directory information of a person.
- 42 (c) "University foundation" has the meaning ascribed to it in 43 NRS 396.405.
 - Sec. 3. The System shall annually provide to the Board of Regents an informational seminar regarding the System, the



organization and management of the System, and the statutory and constitutional duties of the Board of Regents.

- **Sec. 4.** NRS 396.040 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 396.040 1. The Board of Regents consists of [13] nine 4 5 members elected by the registered voters within [the districts described in NRS 396.0415 to 396.046, inclusive.
 - 2. The members of the Board of Regents must be elected as
- 9 (a) At the general election in 2002, and every 6 years thereafter, one member of the Board of Regents must be elected from districts 10 2, 3, 5 and 10. 11
- (b) At the general election in 2004, and every 6 years thereafter, 12 13 one member of the Board of Regents must be elected from districts 14 6. 7. 8. 11 and 13.
- (c) At the general election in 2006, and every 6 years thereafter, 15 16 one member of the Board of Regents must be elected from districts 1, 4, 9 and 12.
 - —3.] districts established by the Legislature.

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- 2. Each member of the Board of Regents must be a resident of the district from which he is elected.
- 3. After the initial terms, each member of the Board of Regents serves for a term of 6 years. A member shall continue to serve on the Board until his successor is elected and qualified.
- **Sec. 5.** NRS 396.0411, 396.0413, 396.0415, 396.0425, 396.043, 396.0435, 396.044, 396.0445, 396.045, 396.0451, 396.0453, 396.0455, 396.0456, 396.0457 and 396.046 are hereby repealed.
- Sec. 6. The Board of Regents of the University of Nevada shall, on or before September 15, 2003, mail a form prepared pursuant to section 2 of this act to each student currently enrolled in a university, state college or community college within the University and Community College System of Nevada.
- **Sec. 7.** 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of NRS 396.040, the terms of the elected members of the Board of Regents of the University of Nevada who are incumbent on January 3, 2005, expire
- 2. Four members of the Board of Regents must be selected at the general election held on November 2, 2004, and take office on January 4, 2005. The terms of these members expire on January 8, 2007.
- 41 3. Five members of the Board of Regents must be selected at 42 the general election held on November 2, 2004, and take office on January 4, 2005. The terms of these members expire on January 5, 2009.



- Sec. 8. 1. This section and sections 1, 2, 3, 6 and 7 of this act 1 become effective on July 1, 2003. 2
- 2. Section 4 of this act becomes effective on January 1, 2004, 3 for the purpose of nominating and electing members to the Board of 4 Regents of the University of Nevada and on January 4, 2005, for all 5 other purposes.
 - 3. Section 5 of this act becomes effective on January 3, 2005.
