SUMMARY—Makes various changes concerning provision of prescription drugs by Department of Human Resources. (BDR 38-775)

EXPLANATION - Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to public welfare; making in skeleton form various changes concerning the provision of prescription drugs by the Department of Human Resources; creating the Pharmacy and Therapeutics Committee within the Department; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Title 38 of NRS is hereby amended by adding 2 thereto a new chapter to consist of the provisions set forth as 3 sections 2 to 12, inclusive, of this act.

4 Sec. 2. As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise 5 requires, the words and terms defined in sections 3 and 4 of this 6 act have the meanings ascribed to them in those sections.

7 Sec. 3. "Department" means the Department of Human 8 Resources.

9 Sec. 4. "Committee" means the Pharmacy and Therapeutics 10 Committee established pursuant to section 6 of this act.

11 Sec. 5. The Department shall include in each program

- 12 administered by the Department that provides prescription drugs a
- 13 requirement that any prescription drug provided by the program



must, unless exempted by the Department at the recommendation
 of the Committee pursuant to subsection 7 of section 9 of this act,
 either:

4 1. Be on the list of preferred prescription drugs created 5 pursuant to section 11 of this act; or

6 2. Require prior authorization before the prescription drug 7 may be provided.

8 Sec. 6. 1. The Pharmacy and Therapeutics Committee, 9 consisting of 11 members appointed by the Governor, is hereby 10 created in the Department.

2. The Governor shall appoint to the Committee:

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12 (a) Six members who are physicians licensed to practice 13 medicine in this state;

14 (b) Four members who are pharmacists registered in this state, 15 one who must have a doctoral degree in pharmacy and be 16 employed by a hospital licensed in this state, and one who must 17 have a doctoral degree in pharmacy and be employed by a retail 18 pharmacy licensed in this state; and

19 (c) One member appointed from a list of three persons 20 provided by the Department.

21 3. The Governor shall appoint to the Committee persons with 22 a broad range of knowledge and expertise in issues concerning 23 drug therapy.

4. A person must not be appointed to the Committee if he is
employed by, compensated by in any manner, has a financial
interest in, or is otherwise affiliated with a business or corporation
that manufacturers prescription drugs.

5. The term of a person appointed to the Committee pursuant
to paragraph (a) or (b) of subsection 2 who fails to satisfy the
requirements set forth in the paragraph pursuant to which he was

31 appointed terminates immediately upon such failure.

32 Sec. 7. 1. The Governor shall appoint the Chairman of the 33 Committee from among its members.

2. After the initial terms, the term of each member of the Committee is 2 years. A member may be reappointed.

36 3. A vacancy occurring in the membership of the Committee 37 must be filled for the remainder of the unexpired term in the same 38 manner as the original appointment.

4. The Committee shall meet at least once every 6 months and *at the times and places specified by a call of the Chairman of the Committee.*

42 5. A majority of the members of the Committee constitutes a 43 quorum for the transaction of business, and the affirmative vote of

44 a majority of the members of the Committee is required to take 45 action.



1 Sec. 8. 1. Members of the Committee serve without 2 compensation, except that a member of the Committee is entitled, 3 while engaged in the business of the Committee, to receive the per 4 diem allowance and travel expenses provided for state officers and 5 employees generally.

2. Each member of the Committee who is an officer or 6 7 employee of the State of Nevada or a local government must be 8 relieved from his duties without loss of his regular compensation 9 so that he may prepare for and attend meetings of the Committee and perform any work necessary to carry out the duties of the 10 Committee in the most timely manner practicable. A state agency 11 or local governmental entity shall not require an officer or 12 13 employee who is a member of the Committee to make up the time 14 that he is absent from work to carry out his duties as a member of 15 the Committee or to use annual vacation or compensatory time for the absence. 16

Sec. 9. The Committee shall:

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18 1. Advise the Department on issues relating to the provision 19 of prescription drugs by programs administered by the 20 Department;

21 2. Recommend guidelines to the Department for prescription 22 drugs that are provided by programs administered by the 23 Department;

24 3. Identify the prescription drugs which should be included 25 on the list of preferred prescription drugs developed by the 26 Department pursuant to section 11 of this act;

4. Identify classes of therapeutic prescription drugs for its
review and perform a clinical analysis of each drug included in
each class that is identified for review;

30 5. Advise the Department concerning the negotiation of 31 supplemental rebates and other program benefits with 32 manufacturers of prescription drugs pursuant to section 12 of this 33 act;

6. Ensure that a manufacturer of prescription drugs who agrees to provide a supplemental rebate or other program benefit to the Department pursuant to section 12 of this act has an opportunity to present evidence which supports the inclusion of its prescription drugs on the list of preferred prescription drugs developed by the Department pursuant to section 11 of this act; and

41 7. Identify prescription drugs which should be exempt from 42 the requirements of section 5 of this act because a change of a 43 prescription of a patient might be detrimental to the patient, 44 including, without limitation, prescription drugs, equipment and 45 supplies for the treatment of diabetes, antiretroviral prescription



drugs that are prescribed for a person infected with the human
 immunodeficiency virus, prescription drugs that are prescribed for
 a person with a mental illness, and prescription drugs for family
 planning and birth control.
 Sec. 10. The Committee may:

6 1. Apply for and accept any gift, donation, bequest, grant or 7 other source of money to aid the Committee in carrying out its 8 duties;

9 2. With the approval of the Director of the Department, enter 10 into contracts for any services necessary to carry out its duties;

11 3. Establish subcommittees to investigate and analyze specific 12 issues that arise as the Committee carries out its duties;

4. Conduct investigations and hold hearings in connection *with its review and analysis; and*

15 5. Direct the Department to assist in its research, 16 investigations, review and analysis.

17 Sec. 11. The Department shall develop a list of preferred 18 prescription drugs to be used by each program administered by the 19 Department that provides prescription drugs. The list must 20 include:

21 **1.** Prescription drugs identified by the Committee pursuant to 22 subsection 3 of section 9 of this act;

23 2. Prescription drugs which are prescribed for the treatment
24 of the same condition or disease as, but are less expensive than,
25 the prescription drugs identified by the Committee pursuant to
26 subsection 3 of section 9 of this act; and

27 3. Certain prescription drugs which are included in the 28 supplemental rebate program operated by the Department 29 pursuant to section 12 of this act.

30 Sec. 12. The Department shall:

31 1. Negotiate supplemental rebates with manufacturers of 32 prescription drugs, including, without limitation, cash rebates;

2. Negotiate other program benefits with manufacturers of prescription drugs, including, without limitation, programs for the management of disease, programs for the donation of prescription drugs, drug utilization control programs, programs to educate and counsel prescribers and beneficiaries of prescription drugs, and programs for the prevention of fraud and abuse involving prescription drugs; and

40 3. Consider the placement of each prescription drug 41 manufactured by a manufacturer who agrees to provide a 42 supplemental rebate or other program benefit to the Department 43 on the list of preferred prescription drugs developed by the 44 Department pursuant to section 11 of this act.



1 **Sec. 13.** As soon as practicable after July 1, 2003, the 2 Governor shall appoint to the Pharmacy and Therapeutics 3 Committee:

4 1. Three physicians licensed to practice medicine in this state 5 and two pharmacists registered in this state to serve initial terms of 1 6 year;

7 2. Three physicians licensed to practice medicine in this state 8 and two pharmacists registered in this state to serve initial terms of 2 9 years; and

10 3. One member appointed from the list provided by the 11 Department of Human Resources to serve an initial term of 2 years.

12 Sec. 14. This act becomes effective on July 1, 2003.
