AN ACT relating to public schools; requiring the Clark County School District to continue its program for the replacement of certain schools; authorizing the Clark County School District to use a certain amount of money from its Fund for Capital Projects to finance the replacement of schools designated for its program; encouraging school districts throughout this state to use certain innovative designs and resources in reconstructing certain schools; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. 1. The Board of Trustees of the Clark County
School District shall continue the program to replace schools
initially established pursuant to section 3 of chapter 562, Statutes of
Nevada 1999, at page 2947.

5 2. Notwithstanding the provisions of NRS 387.328 to the 6 contrary, the Board of Trustees of the Clark County School District 7 may use an amount not to exceed \$230,000,000 from the Fund for



Capital Projects created pursuant to NRS 387.328 to reconstruct at 1 2 least 10 existing older schools, including, without limitation, inner city schools, within the School District. The Board of Trustees shall 3 select the schools designated for reconstruction in accordance with 4 5 the policy adopted pursuant to NRS 393.103 concerning the reconstruction of older buildings for schools or related facilities and 6 7 any priorities for reconstruction set forth in that policy. The schools 8 selected must include elementary schools, at least one middle school 9 or junior high school and at least one high school. The Board of 10 Trustees, upon designating the schools to be reconstructed, shall with all deliberate speed commence the reconstruction of the 11 designated schools with a planned completion date of August 1, 12 13 2008.

14 3. On or before January 10, 2005, the Board of Trustees of the Clark County School District shall submit to the Director of the 15 Legislative Counsel Bureau for transmission to the 73rd Session of 16 the Nevada Legislature an interim report regarding the program to 17 replace schools. The report must include, without limitation, the 18 19 progress of reconstruction of the designated schools. 20

**Sec. 2.** The Legislature hereby encourages:

1. The Clark County School District to continue to construct 21 22 and reconstruct schools by using natural lighting (commonly referred to as "daylighting"), multiple stories for buildings when 23 24 appropriate, solar and other renewable energy sources, and other 25 innovative building designs and plans to provide an effective and 26 ideal learning environment for pupils.

27 2. The remaining school districts throughout this state to 28 establish plans to reconstruct older schools, including, without limitation, inner city schools, by using daylighting, multiple stories 29 30 when appropriate, solar and other renewable energy sources, and 31 other innovative building designs and plans to provide an effective and ideal learning environment for pupils. 32

33 **Sec. 3.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2003.
