AN ACT relating to civil practice; extending the period of limitations for commencing a civil action that has been dismissed because the court lacked jurisdiction over the subject matter of the action under certain circumstances; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1     **Section 1.** Chapter 11 of NRS is hereby amended by adding  
2     thereto a new section to read as follows:  
3     1. *Notwithstanding any other provision of law, and except as*  
4     *otherwise provided in this section, if an action that is commenced*  
5     *within the applicable period of limitations is dismissed because the*  
6     *court lacked jurisdiction over the subject matter of the action, the*  
7     *action may be recommenced in the court having jurisdiction*  
8     *within:*  
9     (a) *The applicable period of limitations; or*  
10    (b) *Ninety days after the action is dismissed,*  
11    *whichever is later.*  
12    2. *An action may be recommenced only one time pursuant to*  
13    *paragraph (b) of subsection 1.*  
14    3. *An action may not be recommenced pursuant to paragraph*  
15    *(b) of subsection 1 more than 5 years after the date on which the*  
16    *original action was commenced.*

1     **4. Paragraph (b) of subsection 1 does not apply to a contract**  
2     **that is subject to the provisions of chapter 104 of NRS.**  
3     **Sec. 2.** This act applies to any action pending on October 1,  
4     2003, or that is filed on or after October 1, 2003.
