- SUMMARY-Provides that certain forms of cancer contracted by firemen are occupational diseases under certain circumstances. (BDR 53-1197)

AN ACT relating to occupational diseases; providing that certain forms of cancer contracted by firemen are occupational diseases under certain circumstances; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** NRS 617.453 is hereby amended to read as follows: 2

617.453 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2:

- (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter, cancer, 3 resulting in either temporary or permanent disability, or death, is an 4 5 occupational disease and compensable as such under the provisions 6 of this chapter if:
- 7 [(a)] (1) The cancer develops or manifests itself [out of and in 8 the course of the employment of *in* a person who, for 5 years or 9 more, has been:
- 10 [(1)] (I) Employed in this state in a full-time salaried occupation of fire fighting for the benefit or safety of the public; or 11
- 12 [(2)] (II) Acting as a volunteer fireman in this state and is entitled to the benefits of chapters 616A to 616D, inclusive, of NRS 13 pursuant to the provisions of NRS 616A.145; and 14
- 15 [(b)] (2) It is demonstrated that:



1 [(1)] (1) He was exposed, while in the course of the 2 employment, to a known carcinogen as defined by the International 3 Agency for Research on Cancer or the National Toxicology 4 Program; and

5 [(2)] (II) The carcinogen is reasonably associated with the disabling cancer.

7 [2.] (b) Compensation awarded to the employee or his 8 dependents for disabling cancer pursuant to [subsection 1] 9 paragraph (a) must include:

10 **[(a)]** (*I*) Full reimbursement for related expenses incurred for 11 medical treatments, surgery and hospitalization; and

12 **[(b)]** (*II*) The compensation provided in chapters 616A to 616D, 13 inclusive, of NRS for the disability or death.

14 [3.] (c) Disabling cancer is presumed to have developed or manifested itself out of and in the course of the employment of any 15 fireman described in this section. This presumption applies to 16 disabling cancer diagnosed after the termination of the person's 17 employment if the diagnosis occurs within a period, not to exceed 18 19 60 months, which begins with the last date the employee actually 20 worked in the qualifying capacity and extends for a period calculated by multiplying 3 months by the number of full years of 21 22 his employment. This presumption must control the awarding of benefits pursuant to this section unless evidence to dispute the 23 24 presumption is presented.

25 2. Notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter, if a 26 person specified in paragraph (a) of subsection 1, other than a 27 person to whom sub-subparagraph (II) of subparagraph (1) of 28 paragraph (a) of subsection 1 applies, demonstrates that he has 29 contracted:

30 (a) Bladder cancer and that he was exposed during the course 31 of his employment to any diesel exhaust, formaldehyde or 32 polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbon;

(b) Brain cancer and that he was exposed during the course of
his employment to any acrylonitrile, formaldehyde or vinyl
chloride;

(c) Colon cancer and that he was exposed during the course of
his employment to any diesel exhaust or formaldehyde;

(d) Hodgkin's lymphoma and that he was exposed during the
course of his employment to any formaldehyde;

40 (e) Kidney cancer and that he was exposed during the course 41 of his employment to any formaldehyde or polycyclic aromatic 42 hydrocarbon;

43 (f) Liver cancer and that he was exposed during the course of 44 his employment to any chloroform, soot or vinyl chloride;



1 (g) Lung cancer and that he was exposed during the course of 2 his employment to any asbestos, diesel exhaust, formaldehyde or 3 vinyl chloride; or

4 (h) Lymphatic or haemotopoietic cancer and that he was 5 exposed during the course of his employment to any acrylonitrile,

6 benzene, formaldehyde, polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbon, soot or 7 vinyl chloride,

8 the cancer is an occupational disease and compensable as such 9 under the provisions of this chapter.

10 3. Any compensation awarded to the employee or his 11 dependents pursuant to subsection 2 must include:

(a) Full reimbursement for related expenses incurred for
medical treatments, surgery and hospitalization; and

14 (b) The compensation provided in chapters 616A to 616D, 15 inclusive, of NRS.
