## Referred to Concurrent Committees on Government Affairs and Ways and Means

SUMMARY—Establishes Commission to Review the Compensation of Legislators. (BDR 23-1319)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: No. Effect on the State: Contains Appropriation not included in Executive Budget.

AN ACT relating to public officers; establishing a Commission to Review the Compensation of Legislators; making an appropriation; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 281 of NRS is hereby amended by adding 2 thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2 to 6, inclusive, of this 3 act.

4 Sec. 2. As used in sections 2 to 6, inclusive, of this act, 5 "Commission" means the Commission to Review the 6 Compensation of Legislators created pursuant to section 3 of this 7 act.

8 Sec. 3. 1. The Commission to Review the Compensation of 9 Legislators, consisting of five members appointed by the Governor, 10 is hereby created.

11 2. After the initial terms, the term of office of each member of 12 the Commission is 4 years. Members of the Commission are 13 eligible for reappointment.

14 3. The Chief of the Budget Division of the Department of 15 Administration must be notified of the appointment of each 16 member.



1 4. The Commission shall elect a Chairman and such other 2 officers as it deems necessary from among its members.

3 5. No more than three members of the Commission may be 4 from the same political party.

5 6. Members of the Commission serve at the pleasure of the 6 Governor.

7 7. If a vacancy occurs in the membership of the Commission, 8 the Governor shall appoint a person to fill the vacancy for the 9 remainder of the unexpired term as soon as practicable.

10 Sec. 4. 1. Each member of the Commission is entitled to 11 receive \$80 for each day that he attends a regularly called meeting 12 of the Commission and, while engaged in the business of the 13 Commission, the per diem allowance and travel expenses provided 14 for state employees generally.

15 2. The Commission shall meet on or before May 15 of each 16 even-numbered year and may meet at such further times as the 17 Chairman deems necessary.

18 3. The Chief of the Budget Division of the Department of 19 Administration shall provide the Commission with administrative 20 support.

21 Sec. 5. A majority of the members of the Commission 22 constitutes a quorum to transact business. The affirmative vote of 23 at least three members is required to approve the 24 recommendations of the Commission regarding compensation.

Sec. 6. 1. The Commission shall:

26 (a) Review the compensation paid to members of the 27 Legislature during and between legislative sessions.

(b) Hold public hearings to discuss issues and receive public
 comment.

30 (c) Determine the level of compensation for Legislators and 31 submit that determination to the Chief of the Budget Division of 32 the Department of Administration pursuant to NRS 353.210.

33 2. In reviewing the compensation required pursuant to 34 subsection 1, the Commission shall:

(a) Compare the current salaries of persons with similar
 qualifications who are employed by the State of Nevada and in the
 public sector;

(b) Determine the minimum salary required to attract and
 retain experienced and competent persons;

40 (c) Consider the average number of days that Legislators serve

The increase or decrease in the level of compensation for *3*. 6 7 the office of Senator or Assemblyman which has been determined 8 by the Commission and approved as part of the budget by the Legislature is not effective until the completion of the term of 9 office of Senator or Assemblyman serving at the time of the 10 approval of such an increase or decrease. 11 Sec. 7. NRS 281.157 is hereby amended to read as follows: 281.157 As used in NRS 281.157 to 281.1575, inclusive, unless the context otherwise requires, "Commission" means the 12 13 14 Commission to Review the Compensation of Constitutional 15 Officers, [Legislators,] Supreme Court Justices, District Judges and 16 Elected County Officers which is created pursuant to 17 NRS 281.1571. 18 19 **Sec. 8.** NRS 281.1571 is hereby amended to read as follows: 20 281.1571 1. There is hereby created a Commission to Review 21 the Compensation of Constitutional Officers, [Legislators,] Supreme Court Justices, District Judges and Elected County Officers, 22 23 consisting of nine members. 2. The members must be appointed by the following persons: 24 25 (a) One member by the Speaker of the Assembly. 26 (b) One member by the Majority Leader of the Senate. 27 (c) One member by the Minority Leader of the Assembly. 28 (d) One member by the Minority Leader of the Senate. 29 (e) Two members by the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court. 30 (f) Three members by the Governor. 31 3. The Commission shall elect a Chairman and such other 32 officers as it deems necessary from among its members. 33 4. A current officer or employee of the State or any of its 34 political subdivisions must not be appointed as a member of the 35 Commission. 5. 1 (b) [Review the compensation paid to the members of the 2 Legislature during and between legislative sessions.

3 (c)] Hold public hearings to discuss the issues and receive public
 4 comment.

5 [(d)] (c) If it determines that changes in legislation are required, 6 request the assistance of the Legislative Counsel in the preparation 7 of a bill draft on or before November 15 of each even-numbered 8 year. Upon completion of the bill draft, the Legislative Counsel 9 shall deliver the bill draft to the appropriate standing committee of 10 the Assembly or Senate within the first week of the next regular 11 legislative session for introduction.

12 2. In reviewing the issues of compensation required by 13 subsection 1, the Commission shall:

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3. The Commission may recommend that any increase in the
 compensation of a county officer apply retroactively if not
 prohibited by law.

**Sec. 10.** NRS 218.210 is hereby amended to read as follows:

27 218.210 Each Senator and Assemblyman is entitled to receive
 28 fas compensation \$130 per day for each day of service:

29 <u>1. During any regular session, for the number of days the</u>

30 Legislature is in session, or in adjournment for not more than 3

31 days, or the maximum number of days for which compensation for a

32 regular session is permitted by the Constitution, whichever is
 33 smaller; and

34 <u>2. During any special session, for the number of days the</u>
 35 Legislature is in session or the maximum number of days for which

36 compensation for a special session is permitted by the Constitution,

37 whichever is smaller.] the compensation determined by the

Commission to Review the Compensation of Legislators pursuant
 to section 6 of this act.

40 Sec. 11. NRS 353.210 is hereby amended to read as follows:

41 353.210 1. Except as otherwise provided in [subsection 6,]
42 subsections 6 and 7, on or before September 1 of each even43 numbered year, all departments, institutions and other agencies of
44 the Executive Department of the State Government, and all agencies
45 of the Executive Department of the State Government receiving



1 state money, fees or other money under the authority of the State, 2 including those operating on money designated for specific purposes by the *Nevada* Constitution or otherwise, shall prepare, on blanks 3 furnished them by the Chief, and submit to the Chief estimates of 4 their expenditure requirements, together with all anticipated income 5 from fees and all other sources, for the next 2 fiscal years compared 6 7 with the corresponding figures of the last completed fiscal year and 8 the estimated figures for the current fiscal year.

9 2. The Chief shall direct that one copy of the forms submitted 10 pursuant to subsection 1, accompanied by every supporting schedule 11 and any other related material, be delivered directly to the Fiscal 12 Analysis Division of the Legislative Counsel Bureau on or before 13 September 1 of each even-numbered year.

3. The Budget Division of the Department of Administration shall give advance notice to the Fiscal Analysis Division of the Legislative Counsel Bureau of any conference between the Budget Division of the Department of Administration and personnel of other state agencies regarding budget estimates. A fiscal analyst of the Legislative Counsel Bureau or his designated representative may attend any such conference.

4. The estimates of expenditure requirements submitted pursuant to subsection 1 must be classified to set forth the data of funds, organizational units, and the character and objects of expenditures, and must include a mission statement and measurement indicators for each program. The organizational units may be subclassified by functions and activities, or in any other manner at the discretion of the Chief.

28 5. If any department, institution or other agency of the Executive Department of the State Government, whether its money 29 30 is derived from state money or from other money collected under 31 the authority of the State, fails or neglects to submit estimates of its expenditure requirements as provided in this section, the Chief may, 32 33 from any data at hand in his office or which he may examine or obtain elsewhere, make and enter a proposed budget for the 34 department, institution or agency in accordance with the data. 35

6. On or before October 31 of each even-numbered year, the
Commission to Review the Compensation of Legislators shall
submit to the Chief for his information in preparing the proposed
executive budget its determination regarding the level of
compensation for Legislators.

7. Agencies, bureaus, commissions and officers of the
Legislative Department, the Public Employees' Retirement System
and the Judicial Department of the State Government shall submit to
the Chief for his information in preparing the proposed executive
budget the budgets which they propose to submit to the Legislature.



Sec. 12. NRS 353.230 is hereby amended to read as follows:

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2 353.230 1. The Chief shall review the estimates, altering, 3 revising, increasing or decreasing the items of the estimates as he may deem necessary in view of the needs of the various 4 departments, institutions and agencies in the Executive Department 5 6 of the State Government and the total anticipated income of the 7 State Government and of the various departments, institutions and 8 agencies of the Executive Department during the next fiscal year. In 9 performing the duties required by this subsection, the Chief shall use 10 the projections and estimates prepared by the Economic Forum pursuant to NRS 353.228. 11

12 2. The Chief shall meet with a fiscal analyst of the Legislative 13 Counsel Bureau, or his designated representative, and personnel of 14 the various departments, institutions and agencies of the Executive 15 Department to discuss:

16 (a) The budgetary requests of each department, institution and 17 agency; and

(b) The budgetary recommendations of the Budget Division of
 the Department of Administration for each department, institution
 and agency,

for the next 2 fiscal years. The Chief shall allow the fiscal analyst of
the Legislative Counsel Bureau, or his designated representative,
full access to all materials connected with the review.

24 3. The Chief shall then prepare a final version of the proposed 25 budget, in accordance with NRS 353.150 to 353.246, inclusive, and shall deliver it to the Governor. The budget must include the 26 27 compensation for Legislators determined by the Commission to 28 Review the Compensation of Legislators pursuant to section 6 of 29 *this act.* The final version of the proposed budget must include the 30 adjusted base budget for each department, institution and agency of 31 the Executive Department, the costs for continuing each program at the current level of service and the costs, if any, for new programs, 32 33 recommended enhancements of existing programs or reductions for the departments, institutions and agencies of the Executive 34 35 Department for the next 2 fiscal years. All projections of revenue 36 and any other information concerning future state revenue contained 37 in the proposed budget must be based upon the projections and 38 estimates prepared by the Economic Forum pursuant to 39 NRS 353.228.

40 4. The Governor shall, not later than 14 calendar days before 41 the commencement of the regular legislative session, submit the 42 proposed budget to the Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau 43 for transmittal to the Legislature. The Governor shall simultaneously 44 submit, as a separate document:



1 (a) An analysis of any new programs or enhancements of 2 existing programs being recommended; and

3 (b) Any increase in or new revenues which are being 4 recommended in the proposed budget.

5 The document must specify the total cost by department, institution 6 or agency of new programs or enhancements, but need not itemize 7 the specific costs. All projections of revenue and any other 8 information concerning future state revenue contained in the 9 document must be based upon the projections and estimates 10 prepared by the Economic Forum pursuant to NRS 353.228.

5. On or before the 19th calendar day of the regular legislative 11 session, the Governor shall submit to the Legislative Counsel 12 13 recommendations for each legislative measure which will be 14 necessary to carry out the final version of the proposed budget or to 15 carrv out the Governor's legislative agenda. These 16 recommendations must contain sufficient detailed information to enable the Legislative Counsel to prepare the necessary legislative 17 18 measures.

19 6. During the consideration of the general appropriation bill 20 and any special appropriation bills and bills authorizing budgeted 21 expenditures by the departments, institutions and agencies operating on money designated for specific purposes by the Nevada 22 Constitution or otherwise, drafted at the request of the Legislature 23 24 upon the recommendations submitted by the Governor with the 25 proposed budget, the Governor or his representative have have the right to appear before and be heard by the appropriation committees 26 27 of the Legislature in connection with the appropriation bill or bills, 28 and to render any testimony, explanation or assistance required of 29 him.

**Sec. 13.** NRS 353.246 is hereby amended to read as follows:

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353.246 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2 of
this section and subsection [6] 7 of NRS 353.210, the provisions of
NRS 353.150 to 353.245, inclusive, do not apply to agencies,
bureaus, commissions and officers of the Legislative Department,
the Public Employees' Retirement System and the Judicial
Department of the State Government.

2. The Legislative Department, the Public Employees' Retirement System and the Judicial Department of the State Government shall submit their budgets to the Legislature in the same format as the proposed executive budget unless otherwise provided by the Legislative Commission. All projections of revenue and any other information concerning future state revenue contained in those budgets must be based upon the projections and estimates prepared by the Economic Forum pursuant to NRS 353.228.



**Sec. 14.** NRS 353.540 is hereby amended to read as follows:

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2 353.540 "State agency" means an agency, bureau, board, 3 commission, department, division or any other unit of the 4 government of this state that is required to submit information to the 5 Chief pursuant to subsection 1 or [6] 7 of NRS 353.210, except for 6 the University and Community College System of Nevada.

7 **Sec. 15.** On or before January 1, 2004, the Governor shall 8 appoint to the Commission to Review the Compensation of 9 Legislators:

10 1. Two members to initial terms that begin on January 1, 2004, 11 and expire on December 31, 2005.

12 2. One member to an initial term that begins on January 1, 13 2004, and expires on December 31, 2006.

14 3. Two members to initial terms that begin on January 1, 2004, 15 and expire on December 31, 2007.

16 Sec. 16. 1. There is hereby appropriated from the State 17 General Fund to the Commission to Review the Compensation of 18 Legislators created pursuant to section 3 of this act the sum of 19 \$6,900 for salary, travel and per diem expenses.

20 2. Any remaining balance of the appropriation made by this 21 section must not be committed for expenditure after June 30, 2005, 22 and reverts to the State General Fund as soon as all payments of 23 money committed have been made.

24 Sec. 17. This act becomes effective on July 1, 2003.

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
