AN ACT relating to campaign practices; prohibiting state and local governments under certain circumstances from paying for publications that prominently feature current public officers who are candidates for elective office; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. NRS 293.725 is hereby amended to read as follows:
293.725 1. The government of this state or a political
subdivision of this state or an agency thereof shall not incur an
expense or make an expenditure to support or oppose:

5 [1.] (a) A ballot question.

6 $\begin{bmatrix} 2 \\ 2 \end{bmatrix}$ (b) A candidate.

7 2. For the purposes of paragraph (b) of subsection 1, an 8 expense incurred or an expenditure made by an entity specified in 9 subsection 1 shall be considered an expense incurred or an 10 expenditure made in support of a candidate if:

11 (a) The expense is incurred or the expenditure is made for the

12 creation or dissemination of a pamphlet, brochure or

13 advertisement that prominently features the activities of a current 14 public officer of the entity who is a candidate for a state, local or

15 federal elective office; and



(b) The pamphlet, brochure or advertisement described in 1 paragraph (a) is created or disseminated during the period 2 specified in subsection 3. 3 3. The period during which the provisions of subsection 2 apply to a particular entity specified in subsection 1 begins when a 4 5 current public officer of that entity files a declaration of candidacy 6 or acceptance of candidacy and ends on the date of the general election, general city election or special election for the office for which the current public officer of the entity is a candidate. 7 8 9 4. As used in this section, a "pamphlet, brochure or advertisement" does not include: 10

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(a) A press release issued to the media by an entity specified in 12 subsection 1; or 13

(b) The official website of an entity specified in subsection 1. 14
