SENATE BILL NO. 188–COMMITTEE ON HUMAN RESOURCES AND FACILITIES

(ON BEHALF OF THE LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE ON HEALTH CARE (NRS 439B.200))

FEBRUARY 21, 2003

Referred to Committee on Finance

SUMMARY—Makes various changes concerning access to health care services for persons in this state. (BDR 40-743)

AN ACT relating to health care; revising various provisions relating to subsidies for malpractice insurance of certain providers of prenatal care; establishing the Nevada Office of Rural Health within the University of Nevada School of Medicine to administer matters relating to the delivery of health care services to rural and frontier areas in this state; establishing the Area Health Education Center Program within the University of Nevada School of Medicine to support education and training programs for certain students, residents and practitioners providing health care services in medically underserved areas in this state; establishing the Medical Education Council of Nevada within the University of Nevada School of Medicine to ensure that Nevada has an adequate, well-trained health care workforce to meet the needs of the residents of this state; revising various provisions relating to the administration of the Nevada Health Service Corps; making appropriations; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.



THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. NRS 442.119 is hereby amended to read as follows:
 442.119 As used in NRS 442.119 to 442.1198, inclusive,
 unless the context otherwise requires:

4 1. "Health officer" includes a local health officer, a city health 5 officer, a county health officer and a district health officer.

6 2. "Medicaid" has the meaning ascribed to it in 7 NRS 439B.120.

8 3. "Medicare" has the meaning ascribed to it in 9 NRS 439B.130.

4. "Provider of prenatal care" [is limited to:] means:

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11 (a) A physician who is licensed in this state and certified in 12 obstetrics and gynecology, family practice, general practice or 13 general surgery.

14 (b) A certified nurse midwife who is licensed by the State Board 15 of Nursing.

16 (c) An advanced practitioner of nursing who has specialized 17 skills and training in obstetrics or family nursing.

(d) A physician assistant who has specialized skills and trainingin obstetrics or family practice.

Sec. 2. NRS 442.1192 is hereby amended to read as follows:

442.1192 1. A provider of prenatal care who provides 21 services to pregnant women, or a health officer acting on behalf of 22 a provider of prenatal care who provides services to pregnant 23 women, in a county or community that lacks services for prenatal 24 25 care may submit an application to the University of Nevada School of Medicine for a grant to subsidize a portion of the malpractice 26 insurance of [a] the provider of prenatal care who provides services 27 to pregnant women in the county or community. 28

29 2. A county or community lacks services for prenatal care if at 30 least one of the following conditions is present:

(a) A provider of prenatal care does not offer services topregnant women within the county or the community.

(b) Fifty percent or more of the live births to women who areresidents of the county occur outside the county.

(c) The percentage of live births to women in the county or
community who received no prenatal care exceeds the percentage of
live births to women in the State who received no prenatal care.

(d) The percentage of live births of babies with low birthweight
to women in the county or community is higher than the percentage
of live births of babies with low birthweight to women in the State.

41 3. If [the applicant is] a county or district health officer [, he] 42 applies for a grant on behalf of a provider of prenatal care, the



1 *county or district health officer* must provide proof of the financial 2 contribution by the county or district for the provision of prenatal services for women who do not qualify for reimbursement pursuant 3 to the State Plan for Medicaid. 4 5

Sec. 3. NRS 442.1194 is hereby amended to read as follows:

442.1194 1. The University of Nevada School of Medicine 6 7 may grant money to [an applicant] a provider of prenatal care or a health officer acting on behalf of a provider of prenatal care who 8 submits an application pursuant to NRS 442.1192 to furnish a 9 subsidy for the malpractice insurance of **a** the provider of prenatal 10 care who provides services in a county or community that lacks 11 services for prenatal care for women. 12

13 2. [An applicant who receives a] A grant from the University of 14 Nevada School of Medicine [may furnish a] must subsidize the 15 *malpractice insurance of the* provider of prenatal care [a subsidy] 16 in an amount up to the difference between the cost of [his] the malpractice insurance of the provider of prenatal care with 17 coverage for the provision of prenatal care and without such 18 19 coverage.

20 Before disbursing a grant pursuant to the provisions of NRS [3. 442.119 to 442.1198, inclusive, the University of Nevada School of 21 22 Medicine shall consult with the Director of the Program for Maternal and Child Health of the Health Division.] 23 24

Sec. 4. NRS 442.1196 is hereby amended to read as follows:

442.1196 1. The application submitted pursuant to NRS 25 442.1192 for a grant to subsidize the malpractice insurance of a 26 27 *provider of prenatal care* must be on the form required by the 28 University of Nevada School of Medicine. 29

2. The application must contain:

30 (a) [Information] If the applicant is a health officer applying 31 on behalf of a provider of prenatal care, information concerning the collaboration between the [applicant and a] health officer and 32 33 *the* provider of prenatal care and medical facilities within the county 34 or community.

35 (b) A plan for providing prenatal care for women in the county or community who have low incomes or who do not qualify for any 36 37 state program for medical care.

38 (c) A plan for improving the health care of pregnant women in 39 the county or community.

40 To be eligible for a subsidy for his malpractice insurance, a 3. 41 provider of prenatal care must submit evidence that:

42 (a) He has completed training in prenatal care that is approved 43 by the University of Nevada School of Medicine;

44 (b) He is currently covered by malpractice insurance;



1 (c) He accepts reimbursement for services rendered from 2 Medicaid and Medicare; and

3 (d) He will continue to provide prenatal care in the specified 4 county or community for not less than 1 year.

5 Sec. 5. Chapter 396 of NRS is hereby amended by adding 6 thereto the provisions set forth as sections 6 to 9, inclusive, of this 7 act.

8 Sec. 6. As used in NRS 396.900 to 396.903, inclusive, unless 9 the context otherwise requires, "practitioner" has the meaning 10 ascribed to it in NRS 439A.0195.

11 Sec. 7. The Nevada Office of Rural Health is hereby 12 established within the University of Nevada School of Medicine to 13 administer matters relating to the delivery of health care services 14 to rural and frontier areas in this state. The Nevada Office of 15 Rural Health shall:

16 1. Evaluate the need for programs concerning the delivery of 17 health care services to rural and frontier areas in this state and 18 make recommendations to the University of Nevada School of 19 Medicine and the Legislature to carry out such programs; and

20 2. Establish, administer and coordinate programs which 21 affect the delivery of health care services to rural and frontier 22 areas in this state, including, without limitation, programs relating 23 to:

(a) The education and training of providers of health care who
 provide services in rural and frontier areas;

(b) The needs of rural and frontier areas for health care
services and the manner in which such health care services may
be effectively delivered;

29 (c) The delivery of health care services to rural and frontier 30 areas;

31 (d) The financing of the delivery of health care services to 32 rural and frontier areas; or

(e) The collection of data necessary for the Nevada Office of
 Rural Health to carry out its duties concerning the delivery of
 health care services to rural and frontier areas.

Sec. 8. 1. The Area Health Education Center Program is 36 37 hereby established within the University of Nevada School of Medicine to support education and training programs for students 38 studying to be practitioners, residents or practitioners who will be 39 40 or are providing health care services in medically underserved 41 areas in this state, including urban and rural areas. The Area 42 Health Education Center Program shall: 43 (a) Assist the area health education centers within Nevada in

43 (a) Assist the area health education centers within Nevada in 44 providing:

45 (1) Career opportunities in health care;



1 (2) Information to practitioners and other providers of 2 health care;

3 (3) Continuing education for practitioners and other 4 providers of health care; and

5 (4) Stipends for the education and training of students 6 studying to be practitioners and residents who will be or who are 7 providing health care services in medically underserved areas in 8 this state;

9 (b) Assess and develop training programs concerning the 10 appropriate curriculum for primary care and other priority health 11 care services;

12 (c) Enhance the training programs in primary care by 13 providing additional entry-level positions and faculty to increase 14 the availability of practitioners and other providers of health care;

15 (d) Increase the percentage of medical students committing to 16 residencies and careers in primary care;

17 (e) Provide a greater percentage of primary care residents to 18 medically underserved areas in this state;

19 (f) Develop and enhance training programs necessary to 20 address the primary health care needs of persons in this state; and

21 (g) Establish interdisciplinary opportunities for education and 22 training for practitioners and other providers of health care.

23 2. As used in this section, "practitioner" has the meaning 24 ascribed to it in NRS 439A.0195.

25 Sec. 9. 1. The Medical Education Council of Nevada is 26 hereby established within the University of Nevada School of 27 Medicine to ensure that Nevada has an adequate, well-trained 28 health care workforce to meet the needs of the residents of this 29 state. The Medical Education Council of Nevada shall:

30 (a) Determine the workforce needs for the provision of health 31 care services in this state;

32 (b) Determine the number and types of positions of 33 employment for which money appropriated to the Medical 34 Education Council of Nevada may used, including, without 35 limitation, positions for practitioners, other providers of health 36 care and other personnel to staff health care facilities and 37 programs;

(c) Investigate and make recommendations to the University of
Nevada School of Medicine and the Legislature on the status and
needs of practitioners, other providers of health care and other
personnel of health care facilities or programs;

42 (d) Determine a method for reimbursing institutions that 43 sponsor practitioners, other providers of health care or other 44 personnel of health care facilities or programs;



1 (e) To the extent authorized by federal law, prepare and submit 2 a formal application to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services of the United States Department of Health and Human 3 Services for the purpose of receiving and dispersing federal money 4 5 for graduate medical education expenses; (f) Distribute a portion of any money appropriated to the 6 7 Medical Education Council of Nevada from the State General 8 Fund and any money received from the United States Department 9 of Health and Human Services for graduate medical education 10 expenses in a manner that: (1) Prepares postgraduate medical and dental residents, as 11 defined by the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical 12 Education, to provide inpatient, outpatient and hospital services in 13 14 various communities and in geographically diverse settings; 15 (2) Encourages the coordination of interdisciplinary clinical training by practitioners and other providers of health 16 care to such postgraduate medical and dental residents; and 17 (3) Promotes funding for accredited clinical training 18 programs provided by practitioners or other providers of health 19 20 care to such postgraduate medical and dental residents; 21 (g) Apply for grants, gifts and donations from public and 22 private sources, including the Federal Government, to carry out 23 the objectives of the Medical Education Council of Nevada; 24 (h) Initiate a cooperative agreement with the Department of 25 Human Resources to promote the intergovernmental transfer of money for the purposes of receiving and dispersing money to carry 26 27 out the objectives of the Medical Education Council of Nevada; 28 and 29 (i) Distribute additional financial resources to training 30 programs for practitioners, other providers of health care or other 31 personnel of health care facilities or programs in the State. 2. As used in this section, "practitioner" has the meaning 32 ascribed to it in NRS 439A.0195. 33 34 **Sec. 10.** NRS 396.900 is hereby amended to read as follows: 396.900 The [Board of Regents] University of Nevada School 35 of Medicine may establish a Nevada Health Service Corps to 36 37 encourage [physicians] practitioners to practice in areas of Nevada in which a shortage of [physicians] that type of practitioner exists. 38 Sec. 11. NRS 396.901 is hereby amended to read as follows: 39 40 The primary purposes of the Nevada Health Service 396.901 41 Corps must be to: 42 1. Recruit [physicians] practitioners for participation in the 43 program; 44 2. Designate areas of Nevada in which a shortage of 45 [physicians] each type of practitioner exists;



1 3. Match [physicians] *practitioners* with the designated areas; 2 and 3 4. Help [physicians] practitioners to negotiate contracts to 4 serve in the designated areas. 5 **Sec. 12.** NRS 396.902 is hereby amended to read as follows: 396.902 The [Board of Regents] University of Nevada School 6 7 of Medicine may: 8 1. Apply for any matching money available for the program 9 from the Federal Government. 10 2. Adopt regulations necessary to carry out the provisions of NRS 396.900 to 396.903, inclusive [-], and section 6 of this act. 11 3. Receive, invest, disburse and account for all money received 12 13 from the Federal Government or any other source for this program. 14 **Sec. 13.** NRS 396.903 is hereby amended to read as follows: 396.903 1. The [Board of Regents] University of Nevada 15 School of Medicine may authorize the Nevada Health Service Corps 16 to administer a program under which [\$15,000 of loans are] money 17 for loans is repaid on behalf of a [physician] practitioner for each 18 year he practices [medicine] in an area of Nevada in which a 19 20 shortage of [physicians exists.] that type of practitioner exists, as determined by the Nevada Office of Rural Health within the 21 22 University of Nevada School of Medicine and the Nevada Health 23 Service Corps. 24 2. To qualify for the program [the physician], a practitioner 25 required to be licensed pursuant to the provisions of chapter 630, 630A, 633 or 634 of NRS must have completed his primary care 26 27 residency and hold an active license issued pursuant to chapter 630, 28 630A, 633 or 634 of NRS. All other practitioners must have completed training in a certified program and have an active 29 30 license, certification or registration from the State of Nevada. 31 Sec. 14. 1. There is hereby appropriated from the State 32 General Fund to the University of Nevada School of Medicine for 33 the development of the Obstetrical Access Program: 34 For the fiscal year 2003-2004 \$4,300,000 35 For the fiscal year 2004-2005 \$3,904,100 The money appropriated to the University of Nevada School 36 2. 37 of Medicine for the development of the Obstetrical Access Program 38 must be used to: 39 (a) Provide financial support and education to faculty and 40 residents in the Departments of Family and Community Medicine 41 and Obstetrics and Gynecology within the University of Nevada 42 School of Medicine and to expand the clinical services provided by 43 such faculty and residents in areas and to populations that need 44 obstetrical services.



1 (b) Provide money to Nevada Health Centers, Inc., to expand 2 the clinical prenatal and obstetrical practice base of community 3 health center clinics and to provide uninsured, underinsured and 4 Medicaid patients with increased access to clinical prenatal and 5 obstetrical care.

6 (c) Establish a fund that allows practicing community providers 7 of prenatal care that are participating in the Obstetrical Access 8 Program to draw upon money to partially compensate them for 9 providing care to patients who have no access to clinical care 10 because of their financial status.

(d) Develop a database of clinical practitioners providing
 prenatal or obstetrical services throughout the State to monitor and
 analyze:

14 (1) The relationship between declining services and the 15 supply and distribution of appropriate providers of health care;

16 (2) The impact of access to care issues on pregnant women, 17 including, without limitation, poor birth outcomes which result from 18 lack of access to care, the financial impact of such poor birth 19 outcomes and the effects of receiving inadequate prenatal care; and

20 (3) The impact of adverse legal decisions on the delivery of 21 obstetrical services.

22 (e) Subsidize malpractice costs for clinical providers of prenatal care who maintain at least 30 percent or more of prenatal or 23 obstetrical patients in their practice who are uninsured, underinsured 24 25 or insured by Medicaid, or who use a sliding fee scale based on a patient's financial resources when charging for such services. The 26 27 subsidy must be calculated based on the number of qualified clinical 28 providers of prenatal care, the proportion of financially 29 compromised patients served by such providers and the total amount 30 of money available for subsidies.

31 3. The sums appropriated by subsection 1 are available for 32 either fiscal year. Any balance of those sums must not be committed 33 for expenditure after June 30, 2005, and reverts to the State General 34 Fund as soon as all payments of money committed have been made.

Sec. 15. 1. There is hereby appropriated from the State General Fund to the Nevada Office of Rural Health established by section 7 of this act within the University of Nevada School of Medicine for the collection of data necessary to carry out programs for the delivery of health care services to rural and frontier areas in this State:

The sums appropriated by subsection 1 are available for 13 either fiscal year. There is hereby appropriated from the State 16 General Fund to the Medical Education Council of Nevada 17 established by section 9 of this act within the University of Nevada 18 School of Medicine to ensure that Nevada has an adequate, well-19 20 trained health care workforce to meet the needs of the residents of 21 this state: 22 For the fiscal year 2003-2004 \$269,550 23 For the fiscal year 2004-2005 \$233,200 24 The sums appropriated by subsection 1 are available for 2. 25 either fiscal year.
