## SENATE BILL NO. 29-SENATOR AMODEI

SUMMARY—Authorizes certain governing bodies to regulate carrying of unconcealed firearms upon public property at special events. (BDR 20-697)

AN ACT relating to firearms; authorizing certain governing bodies to regulate the carrying of unconcealed firearms upon public property at special events; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

**Section 1.** NRS 244.364 is hereby amended to read as follows: 244.364 1. Except as otherwise provided by specific statute, the Legislature reserves for itself such rights and powers as are necessary to regulate the transfer, sale, purchase, possession, ownership, transportation, registration and licensing of firearms and ammunition in Nevada, and no county may infringe upon those rights and powers.

8 2. A board of county commissioners may proscribe by 9 ordinance or regulation the unsafe discharge of firearms.

10 3. A board of county commissioners may proscribe by 11 ordinance or regulation the carrying of an unconcealed firearm 12 by any person, other than a peace officer who is performing his 13 official duties, upon any public property at which a special event is 14 being held.

15 **4.** As used in this section [, "firearm"]:

16 (a) "Firearm" means any weapon from which a projectile is 17 discharged by means of an explosive, spring, gas, air or other force.

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  (1) Is attended or observed by more than 500 persons; or
  (2) Substantially increases or disrupts the normal flow of traffic on any street or highway.
