AN ACT relating to the State Legislature; providing for the reimbursement of Legislators for certain travel expenses incurred during the legislative interim; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 218 of NRS is hereby amended by adding 2 thereto a new section to read as follows:

1. Except as otherwise provided in NRS 218.2207, each 3 Senator and Assemblyman is entitled to receive, during the 4 5 legislative interim, an allowance for travel within his legislative district to participate in public meetings with elected bodies having 6 7 jurisdiction over any area within that legislative district, including, 8 without limitation, a board of county commissioners, city council, 9 town board or board of trustees of a school district. 10 2. The maximum allowance for travel payable to each 11 Senator and Assemblyman pursuant to this section during a legislative interim is \$5,000, except that no allowance for travel 12 13 pursuant to this section is payable to a Senator or Assemblyman for travel that occurs during the legislative interim at any time 14

- 15 after the Senator or Assemblyman has filed a declaration or an
- 16 acceptance of candidacy for an elective office and remains a
- 17 candidate for that office.



3. Transportation must be by the most economical means, 1 considering total cost and time spent in transit. The allowance is: 2

(a) If the travel is by private conveyance, the standard mileage 3 reimbursement rate for which a deduction is allowed for the 4 purposes of federal income tax. 5

(b) If the travel is not by private conveyance, the actual 6 7 amount expended.

4. Claims made pursuant to this section must be paid from 8 9 the Legislative Fund unless otherwise provided by specific statute. 10 A claim must not be paid unless the Senator or Assemblyman submits a signed statement affirming: 11

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(a) The date of travel; and
(b) The places of departure and arrival and, if the travel is by 13

private conveyance, the actual miles traveled. If the travel is not by 14

15 private conveyance, the claim must include a receipt or other evidence of the expenditure. 16

Sec. 2. This act becomes effective upon passage and approval. 17

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
