SUMMARY-Creates Statewide Program for Suicide Prevention within Department of Human Resources. (BDR 40-288)

AN ACT relating to suicide prevention; creating a Statewide Program for Suicide Prevention within the office of the Director of the Department of Human Resources; creating positions within the Statewide Program for Suicide Prevention to coordinate the Statewide Program and to provide training and facilitate networking relating to suicide prevention in certain counties; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Chapter 439 of NRS is hereby amended by adding 1 2 thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2 and 3 of this act.

Sec. 2. 1. There is hereby created within the office of the 3 4

Director a Statewide Program for Suicide Prevention. The Department shall implement the Statewide Program for Suicide 5

Prevention, which must, without limitation: 6

7 (a) Create public awareness for issues relating to suicide 8 prevention;

9 (b) Build community networks; and



1 (c) Carry out training programs for suicide prevention for law 2 enforcement personnel, providers of health care, school employees 3 and other persons who have contact with persons at risk of 4 suicide.

5 2. The Director shall employ a Coordinator of the Statewide 6 Program for Suicide Prevention. The Coordinator:

(a) Must have at least the following education and experience:

8 (1) A bachelor's degree in social work, psychology, 9 sociology, counseling or a closely related field, and 5 years or 10 more of work experience in behavioral health or a closely related 11 field; or

12 (2) A master's degree or a doctoral degree in social work, 13 psychology, sociology, counseling, public health or a closely 14 related field, and 2 years or more of work experience in behavioral 15 health or a closely related field.

16 (b) Should have as many of the following characteristics as 17 possible:

18 (1) Significant professional experience in social services,
19 mental health or a closely related field;

20 (2) Knowledge of group behavior and dynamics, methods of 21 facilitation, community development, behavioral health treatment 22 and prevention programs, and community-based behavioral health 23 problems;

(3) Experience in working with diverse community groups
 and constituents; and

(4) Experience in writing grants and technical reports.

3. The Coordinator shall:

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(a) Provide educational activities to the general public relating
 to suicide prevention;

30 (b) Provide training to persons who, as part of their usual 31 routine, have face-to-face contact with persons who may be at risk 32 of suicide, including, without limitation, training to recognize 33 persons at risk of suicide and providing information on how to 34 refer those persons for treatment or supporting services, as 35 appropriate;

36 (c) Develop and carry out public awareness and media 37 campaigns in each county targeting groups of persons who are at 38 risk of suicide;

39 (d) Enhance crisis services relating to suicide prevention;

40 (e) Link persons trained in the assessment of and intervention 41 in suicide with schools, public community centers, nursing homes

42 and other facilities serving persons most at risk of suicide;

43 (f) Coordinate the establishment of local advisory groups in 44 each county to support the efforts of the Statewide Program;



1 (g) Work with groups advocating suicide prevention, 2 community coalitions, managers of existing crisis hotlines that are nationally accredited or certified, and staff members of mental 3 health agencies in this state to identify and address the barriers 4 that interfere with providing services to groups of persons who are 5 at risk of suicide, including, without limitation, elderly persons, 6 7 *Native Americans, youths and residents of rural communities:*

8 (h) Develop and maintain an Internet or network site with 9 links to appropriate resource documents, suicide hotlines that are nationally accredited or certified, licensed professional personnel, 10 state and local mental health agencies and appropriate national 11 organizations; 12

13 (i) Review current research on data collection for factors 14 related to suicide and develop recommendations for improved 15 systems of surveillance and uniform collection of data;

(j) Develop and submit proposals for funding from agencies of 16 17 the Federal Government and nongovernmental organizations; and

(k) Oversee and provide technical assistance to the person 18 19 employed to act as a trainer for suicide prevention pursuant to 20 section 3 of this act.

21 4. As used in this section:

(a) "Internet or network site" means any identifiable site on 22 23 the Internet or on a network and includes, without limitation:

24 (1) A website or other similar site on the World Wide Web;

25 (2) A site that is identifiable through a Uniform Resource Locator; and 26

27 (3) A site on a network that is owned, operated, 28 administered or controlled by a provider of Internet service.

(b) "Systems of surveillance" means systems pursuant to 29 30 which the health conditions of the general public are regularly 31 monitored through systematic collection, evaluation and reporting of measurable information to identify and understand trends 32 33 relating to suicide.

34 Sec. 3. 1. The Coordinator of the Statewide Program for Suicide Prevention shall employ a person to act as a trainer for 35 suicide prevention and facilitator for networking for Southern 36 37 Nevada. 38

2. The trainer for suicide prevention:

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(a) Must have at least the following education and experience:

40 (1) Three years or more of experience in providing 41 education and training relating to suicide prevention to diverse 42 community groups; or

43 (2) A bachelor's degree, master's degree or doctoral degree 44 in social work, public health, psychology, sociology, counseling or



1 a closely related field, and 2 years or more of experience in 2 providing education and training relating to suicide prevention.

3 (b) Should have as many of the following characteristics as 4 possible:

5 (1) Significant knowledge and experience relating to 6 suicide and suicide prevention;

7 (2) Knowledge of methods of facilitation, networking and 8 community-based suicide prevention programs;

9 (3) Experience in working with diverse community groups 10 and constituents; and

11 (4) Experience in providing suicide awareness information 12 and suicide prevention training.

13 3. The trainer for suicide prevention must be based in a 14 county whose population is 400,000 or more.

15 **4.** The trainer for suicide prevention shall:

16 (a) Assist the Coordinator of the Statewide Program for 17 Suicide Prevention in disseminating and carrying out the 18 Statewide Program in the county in which the trainer for suicide 19 prevention is based;

20 (b) Provide information and training relating to suicide 21 prevention to emergency medical personnel, providers of health 22 care, mental health agencies, social service agencies, churches, 23 public health clinics, school districts, law enforcement agencies 24 and other similar community organizations in the county in which 25 the trainer for suicide prevention is based;

(c) Assist the Coordinator of the Statewide Program for
Suicide Prevention in developing and carrying out public
awareness and media campaigns targeting groups of persons who
are at risk of suicide in the county in which the trainer for suicide
prevention is based;

(d) Assist in developing a network of community-based
programs for suicide prevention in the county in which the trainer
for suicide prevention is based, including, without limitation,
establishing one or more local advisory groups for suicide
prevention; and

(e) Facilitate the sharing of information and the building of
consensuses among multiple constituent groups in the county in
which the trainer for suicide prevention is based, including,
without limitation, public agencies, community organizations,
advocacy groups for suicide prevention, mental health providers
and representatives of the various groups that are at risk for
suicide.

43 **Sec. 4.** The Coordinator of the Statewide Program for Suicide 44 Prevention created by section 2 of this act shall initiate the public 45 awareness and media campaigns for suicide prevention required



pursuant to that program in a county whose population is 400,000 or more.

Sec. 5. On or before January 3, 2005, the Director of the Department of Human Resources shall submit a copy of the Statewide Program for Suicide Prevention and a report concerning the status of the Statewide Program for Suicide Prevention to the

Governor and to the Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau for transmittal to the Legislature.

Sec. 6. This act becomes effective on July 1, 2003.
