AN ACT relating to recreation; extending the reversion date of certain appropriations from previous sessions for park improvements; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- **Section 1.** Section 4 of chapter 536, Statutes of Nevada 1997, as last amended by section 5 of chapter 475, Statutes of Nevada 2001, at page 2385, is hereby amended to read as follows:
 - Sec. 4. Any remaining balance of the appropriation made by section 1 of chapter 536, Statutes of Nevada 1997:
 - 1. For use as provided in subsections 4, 5, 7 and 9 of that section must not be committed for expenditure after June 30, 1999, and reverts to the state general fund as soon as all payments of money committed have been made.
 - 2. For use as provided in subsections 1, 2, 3, 6 and 8 of that section must not be committed for expenditure after June 30, [2003,] 2005, and reverts to the state general fund as soon as all payments of money committed have been made.
- **Sec. 2.** Section 7 of chapter 475, Statutes of Nevada 2001, at page 2385, is hereby amended to read as follows:
 - Sec. 7. Any remaining balance of the appropriation made by section 6 of this act must not be committed for
