AN ACT relating to professional corporations; allowing the formation of certain professional corporations; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

**Section 1.** NRS 89.050 is hereby amended to read as follows: 89.050 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, a professional corporation may be organized only for the purpose of rendering one specific type of professional service and may not engage in any business other than rendering the professional service for which it was organized and services reasonably related thereto, except that a professional corporation may own real and personal property appropriate to its business and may invest its money in any form of real property, securities or any other type of investment.

- A professional corporation may be organized to render a professional service relating to:
- (a) Architecture, interior design, residential design, engineering and landscape architecture, or any combination thereof, and may be composed of persons:
- (1) Engaged in the practice of architecture as provided in chapter 623 of NRS;
- (2) Practicing as a registered interior designer as provided in chapter 623 of NRS; 18



(3) Engaged in the practice of residential design as provided in chapter 623 of NRS;

- (4) Engaged in the practice of landscape architecture as provided in chapter 623A of NRS; and
- (5) Engaged in the practice of professional engineering as provided in chapter 625 of NRS.
- (b) Medicine, homeopathy [and osteopathy,], osteopathy and psychiatric mental health, and may be composed of persons [engaged]:
- (1) **Engaged** in the practice of medicine as provided in chapter 630 of NRS [, persons engaged];
- (2) **Engaged** in the practice of homeopathic medicine as provided in chapter 630A of NRS [and persons engaged];
- (3) Engaged in the practice of osteopathic medicine as provided in chapter 633 of NRS [. Such a]; and
- (4) Practicing in the field of psychiatric mental health.
- A professional corporation described in paragraph (b) may market and manage additional professional corporations which are organized to render a professional service relating to medicine, homeopathy [and osteopathy.], osteopathy and psychiatric mental health.
- 3. A professional corporation may render a professional service only through its officers and employees who are licensed or otherwise authorized by law to render the professional service.
- 4. For the purposes of this section, the term "persons practicing in the field of psychiatric mental health" includes:
- (a) A psychiatrist who is certified by the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology and who is licensed to practice medicine in this state;
  - (b) A psychologist who is licensed to practice in this state;
- (c) A social worker who holds a master's degree in social work and who is licensed by the State as a clinical social worker;
- (d) A registered nurse who is licensed to practice professional nursing in this state and who holds a master's degree in the field of psychiatric nursing; and
- (e) A marriage and family therapist who is licensed pursuant to chapter 641A of NRS.
  - **Sec. 2.** This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.
